# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ELECTIONS.

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:**

1       SECTION 1. There is appropriated out of the general  
2 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$                   or so  
3 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2026-2027 for  
4 the counties to open additional voter service centers for in-  
5 person voting on election day.

6       The sum shall be allocated as follows:

7       (1) \$                   to the city and county of Honolulu;

8       (2) \$                   to the county of Hawaii;

9       (3) \$                   to the county of Kauai; and

10      (4) \$                   to the county of Maui.

11      The sum appropriated shall be expended by the city and  
12 county of Honolulu, county of Hawaii, county of Kauai, and  
13 county of Maui, as applicable, for the purposes of this Act.

14      SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general  
15 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$                   or so  
16 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2026-2027 for  
17 the office of elections to print and mail the digital voter
