## SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE AUDITOR TO CONDUCT A PERFORMANCE AUDIT OF THE  
DEPARTMENT OF HAWAIIAN HOME LANDS.

1        WHEREAS, the mission of the Department of Hawaiian Home  
2 Lands ("DHHL") is "to manage the Hawaiian Home Lands trust  
3 effectively and to develop and deliver lands to native  
4 Hawaiians"; and

5  
6        WHEREAS, despite this clear-cut objective, more than 29,000  
7 applicants remain on DHHL's waitlist for homestead lands; and

8  
9        WHEREAS, tragically, at least 2,100 beneficiaries have died  
10 while awaiting their homestead awards, further showcasing the  
11 unacceptable speed at which DHHL is fulfilling this mission; and

12  
13        WHEREAS, in 2022, the Hawaii State Legislature passed Act  
14 279 appropriating \$600 million to DHHL with the primary goal of  
15 reducing the waitlist; and

16  
17        WHEREAS, this significant investment has produced little of  
18 its anticipated return, with few lots and homesteads being  
19 delivered compared to the original plan; and

20  
21        WHEREAS, audits, largely focusing on financial components,  
22 have been conducted, though no comprehensive audit has been  
23 performed in recent years with focus on DHHL's program  
24 effectiveness, operational efficiency, and success in  
25 effectuating their mission; now, therefore,

26  
27        BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-third  
28 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2026,  
29 that the Auditor is requested to conduct a performance audit of  
30 the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands, with a focus on:

31  
32            (1) The extent to which the Department of Hawaiian Home  
33 Lands is fulfilling its mission;

- 1       (2) The department's efficiency and use of resources;
- 2
- 3       (3) Whether the department's trust funds and revenues are
- 4       sufficient and sustainable;
- 5
- 6       (4) The rate at which land is being developed and awarded
- 7       compared to stated goals;
- 8
- 9       (5) The extent to which the department's programs are
- 10      improving housing stability, economic self-
- 11      sufficiency, and cultural preservation for
- 12      beneficiaries;
- 13
- 14      (6) Beneficiaries' access to information, application
- 15      support, and ease of communication with the
- 16      department;
- 17
- 18      (7) The roles and effectiveness of the Hawaiian Homes
- 19      Commission;
- 20
- 21      (8) And any other factors that contribute to evaluating
- 22      the performance of the Department of Hawaiian Home
- 23      Lands as it relates to fulfilling its mission; and

25       BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Auditor is requested to  
26      Include in the audit:

- 27       (1) Data collection and analysis on the adequacy of
- 28       resources allocated to the department, including
- 29       staffing, infrastructure, and funding;
- 30
- 31       (2) Recommendations for improvements or changes to
- 32       existing policies, structures, or programs to enhance
- 33       efficiency and outcomes;
- 34
- 35       (3) A timeline for implementation of recommended
- 36       improvements or changes; and

39       BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Auditor is requested to  
40      submit to the Legislature a report of any findings and  
41      recommendations, no later than twenty days prior to the  
42      convening of the Regular Session of 2027; and

2 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this  
3 Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, Auditor, Chair of the  
4 Senate Committee on Hawaiian Affairs, Chair of the House  
5 Committee on Judiciary and Hawaiian Affairs, and Chairman of the  
6 Hawaiian Homes Commission.
