RELATING TO HOMEMADE FOOD PRODUCTS.  
Requires the Department of Health to adopt rules for the regulation of farm kitchens producing homemade food products that are no more stringent than those for home kitchens producing homemade food products. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)

<a href="#">SB 2061, SD2, HD1</a> <a href="#">(HSCR1517-26)</a> <a href="#">Status</a>	<p>RELATING TO RESIDENTIAL CONDOMINIUMS.</p> <p>Clarifies the Ninety-Nine Year Leasehold Program by: (1) repealing the prohibition against renting, advertising for rent, or using for any other purpose other than owner-occupied residential use a residential condominium unit; (2) exempting the design, development, and construction contracts from procurement requirements, subject to prevailing wage requirements for laborers and mechanics; (3) requiring HCDA to adopt rules to implement an initial sales period during which residential condominium units are offered only to eligible buyers for owner-occupied residential use; (4) authorizing the sale of a residential condominium unit that is not subject to an income restriction and was not sold within a certain period to be sold to other buyers, as determined by rule by HCDA, without an owner-occupancy requirement; (5) requiring HCDA to adopt rules that require at least sixty per cent of residential condominium units to be income restricted; and (6) requiring HCDA to establish rules to require buyback pricing similar to other state agencies' existing pricing formulas. <a href="#">SB 2050, SD1, HD1</a> <a href="#">(HSCR1500-26)</a> <a href="#">Status</a>	<p>RELATING TO CHIROPRACTIC.</p> <p>Beginning 7/1/2028, allows chiropractic students enrolled in an accredited doctor of chiropractic program to engage in clinical practice as part of the completion of their degree, under certain conditions. Requires a report to the Legislature. Effective 12/31/2050. (HD1)</p>	<p>HED, CPC</p>
<a href="#">SB 2102, SD2, HD1</a> <a href="#">(HSCR1490-26)</a> <a href="#">Status</a>	<p>RELATING TO INDUSTRIAL HEMP.</p> <p>Beginning 7/1/2026, authorizes the use of hemp or hemp-derived feed ingredients in commercial feed for pets, specialty pets, and horses. Requires the Department of Agriculture and Biosecurity to adopt rules. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)</p>	<p>AGR, CPC</p>
<a href="#">SB 2694, SD2, HD1</a> <a href="#">Proposed HD2</a> <a href="#">Status</a>	<p>RELATING TO WATER CARRIERS.</p> <p>Proposed HD2: Requires the Public Utilities Commission to establish automatic adjustment mechanisms to address economic factors sua sponte or on application by a water carrier. Requires the Public Utilities Commission to establish a water carrier inflationary cost index automatic adjustment mechanism. Authorizes the Public Utilities Commission to waive or exempt any water carrier from any requirement under the Hawaii Water Carrier Act. Sunsets 7/1/2029. Effective 7/1/2050. (PROPOSED HD2)</p> <p><b>Note: This proposed draft differs from the version as received by the committee, and contains amendments that, while significant, do not change the bill's intended purpose. RELATING TO MENTAL HEALTH.  
Expands the services eligible for Medicaid Prospective Payment System reimbursement to include certain services furnished by a federally qualified health center or rural health clinic and provided by mental health professionals under the clinical supervision of a licensed mental health professional. Requires the Department of Human Services to adopt rules for this purpose and seek federal approvals as necessary. Specifies that implementation is contingent upon and only to the extent approved by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)

RELATING TO PSYCHOLOGISTS.  
Establishes a three-year pilot program in the County of Kauai to allow qualified psychologists under the supervision of a supervising psychiatrist limited authority to prescribe psychotropic medications to patients between the ages of eighteen and sixty-five years under the care of the psychologist. Requires the Board of Psychology to adopt rules. Requires the State Health Planning and Development Agency to report to the Legislature. Sunsets 6/30/2031. (HD1)
