Additional work with Instructional Leadership Teams in twelve schools includes planning and implementation of training, school visitations, and principal coaching.

Involved in the implementation of the first A'o Kumu, a teacher training program for DOE teachers interested in ways to integrate culturally-based online curriculum in their courses for professional development credit.
