Successes include the passage of the first local social host ordinance in the State of Hawai'i and the repeal of a countywide 24-hour alcohol sales law.
- Co-founder and Director of the Hawai'i Alcohol Policy Alliance in 2018, whose focus is on passing and ensuring state-level alcohol policies that follow public health best practices. Current campaigns include an alcohol excise tax increase and lowering the BAC level from .08 to .05.
- Lead community organizer in the establishment of the East Hawai'i Drug-Free Coalition in 2019 whose focus is on preventing underage drinking through community-level prevention strategies.
- Provide direct oversight of staff, fiscal management, reporting, and overall operations of the coalitions.
- Successfully secured an annual budget of approximately \$500,000 through local, state, and federal grants.
