A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE OFFICE OF WELLNESS AND RESILIENCE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the State has
2 accumulated an estimated \$470,000,000 in unspent temporary
3 assistance for needy families program funding with approximately
4 \$333,000,000 in encumbrances on that funding. These moneys are
5 required to be spent on needy families that meet the eligibility
6 requirements of the temporary assistance for needy families
7 program.

8 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to require the
9 office of wellness and resilience, in consultation with the
10 department of human services, to develop a comprehensive plan
11 for the establishment of a kakou pilot program to support
12 families and children in need.

13 SECTION 2. (a) The office of wellness and resilience, in
14 consultation with the department of human services, shall
15 develop a comprehensive plan for the establishment of a kakou
16 pilot program to support families and children in need.



- 1 (b) For the purposes of the kakou pilot program, the
2 office of wellness and resilience shall create a plan to:
- 3 (1) Provide services for children in need, including child
4 wellness visits;
 - 5 (2) Distribute food boxes to eligible families, as needed;
 - 6 (3) Provide counseling and related support services to
7 eligible families with a focus on families exiting a
8 foster family placement and other at-risk children as
9 determined by the plan;
 - 10 (4) Administer trauma-informed care services to eligible
11 families and children at risk of neglect; and
 - 12 (5) Provide any other related services to support families
13 and children in need in accordance with this Act.
- 14 (c) The office of wellness and resilience may adopt
15 policies and procedures necessary to develop the plan for the
16 kakou pilot program and to carry out the purposes of this Act.
- 17 (d) The office of wellness and resilience shall:
- 18 (1) Submit a preliminary report of its comprehensive plan
19 to develop the kakou pilot program, including any
20 proposed legislation, a recommended implementation
21 structure identifying the administering agency or



1 agencies, and recommendations on whether the pilot
2 program should be established, to the legislature no
3 later than twenty days prior to the convening of the
4 regular session of 2027; and

5 (2) Submit a final report of its plan to the legislature
6 no later than June 30, 2027.

7 (e) The planning period for the kakou pilot program shall
8 expire on June 30, 2027.

9 (f) For the purposes of this Act, "eligible families"
10 means families who meet eligibility criteria for the temporary
11 assistance for needy families program, as determined by the
12 department of human services, or any other families meeting
13 standards and requirements recommended by the office of wellness
14 and resilience in its comprehensive plan and approved by the
15 administering agency or agencies; provided that such standards
16 shall comply with applicable federal requirements.

17 SECTION 3. Beginning July 1, 2028, the department of human
18 services, pursuant to section 2(d), is authorized and may expend
19 temporary assistance for needy families funds for the purposes
20 of the kakou pilot program, including \$130,000 per year for an
21 external evaluator to conduct data collection and to assess



1 whether the pilot program meets at least one of the purposes of
2 the temporary assistance for needy families program and whether
3 the pilot program effectively addresses that purpose.

4 SECTION 4. If any part of this Act is found to be in
5 conflict with federal requirements that are a prescribed
6 condition for the allocation of federal funds to the State, the
7 conflicting part of this Act shall be inoperative solely to the
8 extent of the conflict and with respect to the agencies directly
9 affected, and this finding shall not affect the operation of the
10 remainder of this Act in its application to the agencies
11 concerned.

12 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.




