- Assists the O&M Manager and Operations Manager in techniques and procedures for the efficient and profitable operation of the buildings under BOSC density and supervision of assigned personnel.
- Establishes and maintains effective relationships and communications, both internally and externally, with persons of all backgrounds and organizational levels
- Accepts responsibility for his/her own performance and demonstrates the capability to assist other team members in reaching success within the organization
- Prepares accurate, detailed, and timely reports

May 2024-August 2024: Planner/ Scheduler at Amentum, I provide assistance to Operations & Maintenance (O&M) functions in support of the Base Operations Support Contract. The position is responsible for supporting project or operations/maintenance planning and scheduling activities including preventative maintenance, work orders, start up and operations. Knowledgeable of planning and scheduling concepts and principles including effects on operational performance. Familiar with data sources and supports basic schedule development.

May 2021-April 2024: I became the Harbor Operation Chief and Physical Security Officer which I. As the harbor Operation and security chief I led complex operation of 2.9 mile and \$1.5 B PIER COMPLEX. Completed two facility response assessments and completed 82 security evolutions for visiting ships in harbor. Conducted Maritime Interdiction Operations with the Japanese Coast Guard. Trained and perform over 200 hours of waterborne force protection for six US visiting vessels, maintaining a high security posture. As the Harbor Operations subject matter expert, BMC Vigil earned the title of Harbor Operations Chief, and he played a significant role assisting station Operations in spearheaded the comprehensive exercise program promoting regional, bilateral training with the Japanese Ground Self-Defense Force (JGSDF) along with exercising the installation's mass casualty response capabilities and Non-Combatant Evacuation Operations procedures required to exercise and validate adequate force protection measures for all personnel aboard MCAS Iwakuni including dependents. BMC Vigil and his Harbor Team was successful in realistically exercising base defense capabilities and interoperability between the air station's Provost Marshal's Office (PMO) and the JGSDF, culminating in Exercises ACTIVE SHIELD 2021, ACTIVE SHIELD 2022, and ACTIVE SHIELD 2023, that would be critical in the event of an Operational Plan execution.

As the Harbor Operations Chief he identified the air station need of a new brow stand for in bound transient ships arriving to the general-purpose pier. He immediately procured funding through the Comptroller Office, submitted a purchase request 20 ft brow stand at the cost of 395,000 dollars. In addition when facilities was unable to inflate and install fenders, BMC took it upon himself to train his division to properly place, inspect, and repair the brow stand saving MCAS Iwakuni more than 100 thousand dollars on contract cost. The new brow stand allowed the air station to safely moor 84 vessels to the pier that required additional height for the transient ship's brow.

As Harbor Operations Chief, responsible for the daily operation of a 1,200 feet, 2.5 million dollars pier complex he expertly led, trained and mentored 50 military personnel in the completion of over 100 mooring evolutions, resulting in the mishap-free transfer of 60 million gallons of JP-5 aviation fuel to over 21,700 aircraft and the on load and off load of more than 10 Million pounds of cargo supporting numerous joint operation in Indo-Pacific region. Instrumental in the planning and the execution of numerous joint military exercises including Valiant Shield, MCAS Iwakuni Aircraft Mishap, E2D Aircraft offload, C2A and KC-130J Salvage, Friendship Day 2021, Friendship Day 2022, Friendship Day 2023, E2D offloads and Keen Sword. Coordinated the first ever JGSDF V-22 arrival and offload, a major milestone in Japanese history. Devoted countless hours generating a port brief presentation for the perspective arrival of the USS Tripoli and countless other naval warships. He also led his division of 25 Sailors

standing more than over 26,500 hours of watch as Harbor Dispatcher maintaining security for 7.2 nautical miles of MCAS Iwakuni's restricted water zone. Coordinating with air station's PMO, masterfully led, trained and mentored more than 100 Marines and Sailors in the performance of more 5,000 hours of waterborne force protection and 1,200 Random Antiterrorism measures for 31 visiting United States vessels and 13,000 transiting personnel supporting Marine Aircraft Group 12, Marine Aviation Logistics Squadron 12 (MALS-12), Marine Wing Support Squadron 171, Marine Fighter Attack Squadron 125, and Army during numerous joint military exercises in Indo-Pacific region. In addition, BMC Vigil was responsible for reporting over 200 unauthorized vessels that enter restricted area of responsibility to Iwakuni Coast Guard and civilian law enforcement entities who is responsible for the prosecution of all unauthorized assets that enter MCAS Iwakuni restricted area. His efforts ensured good order and discipline was maintained and enhanced base Force Protection Posture.

As Harbor Security Anti-Terrorism Watch Bill Coordinator. Responsible for generating monthly Random Anti-Terrorism Measure watch bills with 100 Sailors and Marines consisting of two random boat patrols daily resulting in over 2,000 hours of boat patrols increasing the security of the harbor directly providing waterborne force protection for 30 visiting vessel and airfield operations. He also implemented MCAS Iwakuni's first U.S. Coast Guard Maritime Security (MARSEC) Levels designed to easily communicate to the Coast Guard and our maritime industry partners pre-planned scalable responses for credible threats in the region.

He was responsible for the submission and approval for more than 1,000 request to access to Post 9 and inter harbor, and numerous restricted areas located throughout the base for personnel, visiting vessels, crewmembers, contract workers, vehicles, and working boats.

Throughout his tenure, BMC Vigil exemplary performance and loyal dedication to MCAS Iwakuni's mission accomplishment are unmatched. His accomplishments have assured MCAS Iwakuni's continued operational readiness and the imprint of his leadership will have a long-lasting, positive impact on the United States-Japan alliance. It would be one of the hardest tasks to replace his prowess, leadership, and technical expertise.

March 2019-May 2021: Transfer to the USS John S. McCain DDG-56 as a divisional LCPO he aided in training and preparing 16 junior sailors in SAR, ultimately allowing OD division to complete a successful MOB-S certification with a 90% in the successful reception of 200,000 gallons of F-76 fuel and 2,500 pounds of cargo stores. I supervised 50 personal transfer and 110 helicopter deck landing qualifications with precision and expertise to include operations with the Indian Navy, Australian Navy, and Japanese SDF Forces.

May 2018-March 2019: Went to Commander Task Force 70 staff duty as the Force 1st LT where I tracked and ensured timely updates for over 200 Category 3 and 4 maintenance Casualty reports for 12 Commander Task Force 70 Ships, four Carrier Strike Group 3 ships and multiple independent deployed ships. Coordinated technical oversight and coordination of deck, aviation and small boat operations of 12 forward deployed naval forces Japan assigned ships.

March 2015-May 2018: I transfer to AFLOAT TRAINING GROUP MIDPAC as Seamanship team lead, I lead 24 training events onboard five warships, training 1,385 sailors in deck seamanship fundamentals and ensuring that seamanship readiness across the waterfront supported a demanding OPTEMPO As operations department LPO and assistant scheduler, I coordinated the scheduling and personnel management for MOB-S (Seamanship), MOB-A (Aviation), SAR (Search and Rescue), and MOBN(

Navigation) events on seven different ships, improving overall certification scores above 90% on the Pearl Harbor waterfront.

December 2011-March 2015: I then transfer to the USS Paul Hamilton DDG-60 where he conducted 170 flight evolutions as flight deck officer, 18 unrep's receiving over 2 million gallons of fuel, 569 pallets of cargo and 32 small boat operations as POIC during an accelerated and extended nine-month deployment to seventh fleet.

April 2008- December 2011: I went to instructor duty at CSCS DET WEST as small craft instructor. I delivered over 1,500 mishap-free hours of high risk instruction to the supervisor and apprentice courses. As part of the command mobile training team, I participated in support of PACNORWEST RHIB Coxswain course providing training to 24 students and assisting the command with their high-risk emergency action certification.

February 2006-March 2008: I then transfer to USS Curts FFG-38 in March 2006 where I deployed to support Counter Narco-Terrorism deployment. I conducted patrol's that was essential role in the transfer of 3.5 tons of contraband and 57 detainees during USS Curts deployment.

October 2002-February 2006: First ship assignment was USS Chosin CG-65. I deployed twice where he coordinated the safe transfer of 1,000,000 gallons of F-76 and F-44 fuel during two deployments in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom and Enduring Freedom. I contributed to 200 hours of safe helicopter launches and recoveries, 18 successful unrep's, and 250 security patrol boat operations in the Arabian Gulf.
