# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PROPERTY DAMAGE OF CRITICAL INFRASTRUCTURE  
FACILITIES.

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:**

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 708, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is  
2 amended by adding a new section to part III to be appropriately  
3 designated and to read as follows:

4 "§708- Criminal property damage of a critical  
5 infrastructure facility. (1) A person commits the offense of  
6 criminal property damage of a critical infrastructure facility  
7 if the person intentionally or knowingly damages any critical  
8 infrastructure facility without the owner's or operator's  
9 consent.

10 (2) Criminal property damage of a critical infrastructure  
11 facility is a class C felony.

12 (3) For the purposes of this section:

13 "Critical infrastructure facility" has the same meaning as  
14 "critical infrastructure" as defined in section 708-890.

15 "Damage" has the same meaning as in section 708-890."



1 SECTION 2. Section 708-890, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is  
2 amended by amending the definition of "critical infrastructure"  
3 to read as follows:

4 ""Critical infrastructure" means publicly or privately  
5 owned or operated systems or assets vital to the defense,  
6 security, economic security, public health or safety, or any  
7 combination thereof, of the State or nation. "Critical  
8 infrastructure" includes:

- 9 (1) Gas and oil production, storage, and delivery systems;
- 10 (2) Water supply systems;
- 11 (3) Telecommunications networks;
- 12 (4) Electrical power delivery systems;
- 13 (5) Finance and banking systems;
- 14 (6) Emergency services, such as medical, police, fire, and  
15 rescue services;
- 16 (7) Transportation systems and services, such as highways,  
17 mass transit, airlines, and airports; [~~and~~]
- 18 (8) Government operations that provide essential services  
19 to the public[-]; and
- 20 (9) Broadband, wireless, and cable television networks."



1 SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that  
2 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were  
3 begun before its effective date.

4 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed  
5 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

6 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 3000.
