



1 "First responder" means any firefighter, emergency medical  
2 personnel, police, or authorized emergency worker.

3 "Predictive evacuation order" means an evacuation order  
4 issued based on credible threat modeling.

5 "Wilful non-compliance" means knowingly remaining in an  
6 evacuation zone after an evacuation order has been issued.

7 § -2 **Immunity; evacuation.** First responders and  
8 emergency services agencies shall be immune from liability for  
9 issuing predictive evacuation orders or not conducting rescues  
10 when individuals exhibit wilful non-compliance during an active  
11 hazard period. Any person who exhibits wilful non-compliance by  
12 ignoring evacuation orders assumed the risk and waives any  
13 liability claims.

14 § -3 **Duty; priorities.** No emergency responder shall be  
15 required to enter a danger zone during an active hazard period  
16 once a predictive evacuation order has been issued. Emergency  
17 responders shall prioritize stabilization and recovery after  
18 hazards subside.

19 § -4 **Exceptions.** This chapter shall not apply if an  
20 individual lacked sufficient notice of a predictive evacuation  
21 order or the ability to evacuate."



1 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 3000.



**Report Title:**

Evacuation; Immunity; Assumption of Risk; Emergency Responder

**Description:**

Protects emergency responders from liability during periods of evacuation. Provides that individuals who wilfully fail to comply with predictive evacuation orders assume the risk and waive liability. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)
