# HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE COMPTROLLER TO ESTABLISH A WORKING GROUP TO  
DISCUSS AND DRAFT PLANS FOR A GLOBAL WAR ON TERROR MEMORIAL  
ON THE GROUNDS OF THE HAWAII STATE CAPITOL.

1           WHEREAS, since the terrorist attacks of September 11, 2001,  
2 members of the United States Armed Forces have participated in  
3 the Global War on Terror, including operations such as Operation  
4 Enduring Freedom and Operation Iraqi Freedom, in defense of the  
5 United States and to promote global security; and  
6

7           WHEREAS, the people of Hawaii have a long tradition of  
8 military service, and the military remains a significant part of  
9 the State's communities, with tens of thousands of active-duty  
10 personnel, National Guard members, and veterans residing in  
11 Hawaii; and  
12

13           WHEREAS, according to estimates, more than three thousand  
14 five hundred members of the Hawaii National Guard alone have  
15 deployed to Iraq and Afghanistan in support of the Global War on  
16 Terror, with a high percentage of these Guard personnel  
17 mobilized for overseas service since 2001; and  
18

19           WHEREAS, Hawaii is home to a substantial veteran population  
20 -- approximately 21.8 percent of Hawaii's living veterans  
21 reported having enlisted in or after September 2001, indicating  
22 service during the Global War on Terror era -- reflecting the  
23 contribution of Hawaii's servicemembers to post-9/11 conflicts  
24 worldwide; and

26           WHEREAS, the sacrifices made by these servicemembers  
27 include years of overseas duty; separation from family and  
28 friends; the inherent risks of combat; and in many cases, long-  
29 term effects on health and well-being; and

1 WHEREAS, while other conflicts are commemorated by  
2 memorials and monuments across the nation, the service and  
3 sacrifices of Hawaii's veterans of the Global War on Terror are  
4 not yet recognized by a dedicated memorial on the grounds of the  
5 Hawaii State Capitol; and

6  
7 WHEREAS, it is fitting and appropriate for the State to  
8 honor those who served, along with their families and the  
9 broader community affected by this extended period of military  
10 commitment; and

11  
12 WHEREAS, the establishment of a working group with  
13 representatives from veterans' organizations, military entities,  
14 state agencies, families of servicemembers, and other  
15 stakeholders would ensure thoughtful planning and community  
16 input for an appropriately designed memorial to commemorate the  
17 Global War on Terror; now, therefore,

18  
19 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the  
20 Thirty-third Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session  
21 of 2026, the Senate concurring, that the Comptroller is  
22 requested to establish a working group to discuss and draft  
23 plans for a Global War on Terror memorial on the grounds of the  
24 Hawaii State Capitol; and

25  
26 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group consist of:

- 27  
28 (1) The Comptroller, or the Comptroller's designee;  
29  
30 (2) The Adjutant General, or the Adjutant General's  
31 designee;  
32  
33 (3) The Commander of the Hawaii Army National Guard, or  
34 the Commander's designee;  
35  
36 (4) The Commander of the Hawaii Air National Guard, or the  
37 Commander's designee;

39 (5) The Director of the Office of Veterans' Services, or  
40 the Director's designee;

1 (6) Representatives of active-duty members and the reserve  
2 components of the United States Armed Forces;

3  
4 (7) Representatives from veterans' organizations;

5  
6 (8) Architects, planners, and designers with experience in  
7 the construction of memorials; and

8  
9 (9) Family members of servicemembers; and

10  
11 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group is requested  
12 to:

13  
14 (1) Discuss and draft plans for the creation of a Global  
15 War on Terror memorial on the grounds of the Hawaii  
16 State Capitol, including potential themes, locations,  
17 design principles, and estimated costs;

18  
19 (2) Consult with veterans, active-duty service members,  
20 military family organizations, and community groups to  
21 gather input and recommendations;

22  
23 (3) Develop a plan and timeline for the design and  
24 construction of the Global War on Terror memorial,  
25 including, if appropriate, fundraising or requests for  
26 appropriations from the State; and

27  
28 (4) Submit to the Legislature and Governor a final report  
29 with recommendations and proposed plans by a date to  
30 be determined by the working group; and

31  
32 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Accounting  
33 and General Services shall provide any necessary administrative  
34 support to the working group, including the preparation and  
35 drafting of the final report; and


