
HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE HAWAII EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY TO ASSIST IN ORGANIZING A STATEWIDE SUMMIT OF ORGANIZATIONS WORKING ON COMMUNITY RESILIENCE HUBS.

1 WHEREAS, the increasing likelihood and severity of natural
2 disasters caused by climate change have made emergency
3 preparedness to protect lives and property more urgent; and
4

5 WHEREAS, community resilience hubs can help residents
6 prepare for natural or human-caused disasters by serving as
7 centers for coordination, resources, and information before,
8 during, and after emergencies; and
9

10 WHEREAS, organizations throughout the State are actively
11 working to develop and support community resilience hubs,
12 including organizations that possess significant expertise and
13 experience in community-based disaster preparedness; and

15 WHEREAS, convening a statewide summit of organizations
16 working on community resilience hubs would provide an
17 opportunity for stakeholders to share best practices, strengthen
18 partnerships, and develop coordinated strategies to enhance
19 community resilience across Hawaii; now, therefore,

21 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the
22 Thirty-third Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session
23 of 2026, the Senate concurring, that the Hawaii Emergency
24 Management Agency is requested to assist in organizing a
25 statewide summit of organizations working on community
26 resilience hubs; and

28 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Hawaii Emergency Management
29 Agency is requested to partner with Vibrant Hawaii and Community

- (2) Exploring strategies for establishing and strengthening community resilience hubs throughout the State; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Hawaii Emergency Management Agency is requested to support the planning and coordination of the summit and provide technical assistance and subject matter expertise, as appropriate; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Hawaii Emergency Management Agency is requested to submit a report of its findings and recommendations regarding the establishment of community resilience hubs in the State, including any proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2027; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Administrator of the Hawaii Emergency Management Agency, Chief Executive Officer of Vibrant Hawaii, and Director of the Community Engagement for Resilient Neighborhoods.
