
HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE UNITED STATES CONGRESS TO PASS H.R. 2687, ALSO KNOWN
AS THE END KIDNEY DEATHS ACT.

1 WHEREAS, kidney disease and kidney failure are serious,
2 life-threatening medical conditions that disproportionately
3 impact people of color; and
4

5 WHEREAS, currently more than five thousand Hawaii residents
6 rely on dialysis and hundreds die each year; and
7

8 WHEREAS, patients from rural and low-income communities are
9 significantly more likely to die from kidney disease due to the
10 deep inequities in access to timely and effective treatment; and
11

12 WHEREAS, of the nearly ninety-five thousand Americans
13 nationwide who are waiting for a kidney transplant, several
14 thousands die each year, despite kidney transplantation being a
15 proven, life-saving therapy; and
16

17 WHEREAS, while dialysis can sustain a patient's life, it
18 also significantly diminishes quality of life, shortens life
19 expectancy, and imposes substantial physical, emotional, and
20 financial burdens on patients and families; and
21

22 WHEREAS, the federal government spends approximately
23 \$50,000,000,000 annually on dialysis care, which represents
24 nearly one percent of all federal spending; and
25

26 WHEREAS, kidney transplantation not only restores health
27 and independence for patients but also reduces long-term public
28 expenditures, with each transplant estimated to save
29 approximately \$500,000 compared to the lifetime cost of
30 dialysis; and

1 WHEREAS, expanding access to kidney transplantation has the
2 potential to save up to ten thousand lives each year and reduce
3 federal health care spending by approximately \$4,000,000,000
4 annually; and

6 WHEREAS, living donor kidney transplants are widely
7 recognized as the gold standard of kidney care, offering better
8 outcomes and longer graft survival than deceased donor
9 transplants; and

10
11 WHEREAS, living kidney donation is already among the most
12 tightly regulated medical procedures in the United States, with
13 comprehensive medical, psychological, and ethical safeguards to
14 protect donor safety and prevent coercion; and

15
16 WHEREAS, the number of living kidney donors has remained
17 largely unchanged for more than twenty-five years, demonstrating
18 that existing policies have failed to meet the growing need for
19 donors; and

20
21 WHEREAS, H.R. 2687, also known as the End Kidney Deaths
22 Act, was introduced on April 7, 2025, to the 119th Congress; and

23
24 WHEREAS, the End Kidney Deaths Act would allow for
25 regulated, refundable tax credits for individuals who donate a
26 kidney to a stranger; and

27
28 WHEREAS, providing tax credits for non-directed living
29 donation recognizes the burdens of donation while preserving
30 existing donor protections; and

31
32 WHEREAS, non-directed kidney donation can initiate
33 transplant changes that save multiple lives from a single act of
34 generosity; and

35
36 WHEREAS, the End Kidney Deaths Act is a bipartisan,
37 evidence-based proposal that address human suffering and fiscal
38 responsibility; now, therefore,

40 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the
41 Thirty-third Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session
42 of 2026, the Senate concurring, that this body urges the United

1 States Congress to pass H.R. 2687, also known as the End Kidney
2 Deaths Act; and

4 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this body urges Hawaii's
5 congressional delegation to support the End Kidney Deaths Act as
6 a means of saving lives, reducing health inequities that affect
7 rural and low-income communities, and improving the
8 sustainability of the nation's health care system; and


10 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
