
HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

RECOGNIZING OPEN WATER LIFEGUARDS AS FIRST RESPONDERS IN THE
STATE OF HAWAII.

1 WHEREAS, open water lifeguards perform an essential public
2 safety function by protecting countless lives from death or
3 serious injury among residents and visitors throughout the
4 State; and

5
6 WHEREAS, open water lifeguards are professionals designated
7 as Ocean Safety Officers in the counties of Kaua'i and Maui, and
8 as Water Safety Officers in the City and County of Honolulu and
9 county of Hawai'i, reflecting their specialized training,
10 responsibilities, and scope of duty; and

11
12 WHEREAS, in the performance of their duties, open water
13 lifeguards routinely place themselves at significant risk to
14 their own lives and physical safety in dynamic and hazardous
15 ocean and shoreline environments; and

16
17 WHEREAS, open water lifeguards are frequently among the
18 first personnel to respond to emergencies on the State's beaches
19 or in state waters and operate alongside police officers and
20 firefighters to protect life, secure scenes, and preserve public
21 safety until additional responders arrive; and

22
23 WHEREAS, the duties of open water lifeguards extend beyond
24 ocean rescues and include responding to emergencies such as
25 cardiac arrests, traumatic injuries, and motor vehicle
26 collisions that occur on or near beaches, parks, and public
27 roadways; and

28
29 WHEREAS, many open water lifeguards are cross-trained in
30 emergency medical response, marine fire safety, law enforcement
31 support, and water rescue craft operations; and

2 WHEREAS, open water lifeguards undergo rigorous and
3 continuous training, including high-performance cardiopulmonary
4 resuscitation, automated external defibrillator use, advanced
5 rescue techniques, and emergency scene management; and

7 WHEREAS, open water lifeguards respond to emergencies by
8 attending to, treating, assisting, and transporting victims,
9 which collectively constitute the four defined duties of an
10 emergency response employee; and
11

12 WHEREAS, open water lifeguards not only protect human life
13 but also safeguard property, preserve evidence, and protect the
14 environment, which together represent the four core tenets
15 commonly used to define a first responder; and
16

17 WHEREAS, the term "first responder" is commonly defined as
18 an individual with specialized training who is among the first
19 to arrive at and provide assistance at the scene of an
20 emergency; and
21

22 WHEREAS, open water lifeguards differ fundamentally from
23 pool lifeguards due to the unpredictable and hazardous
24 environments in which they operate and the wide range of
25 emergency situations and locations to which they respond; and

27 WHEREAS, many other countries formally recognize lifeguards
28 as emergency responders and grant them access to programs,
29 protections, and resources afforded to first responders; now,
30 therefore,

32 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the
33 Thirty-third Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session
34 of 2026, the Senate concurring, that this body recognizes open
35 water lifeguards as first responders in the State of Hawaii; and

37 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this body acknowledges the
38 essential role open water lifeguards play in emergency response,
39 public safety, and community wellbeing throughout the State of
40 Hawaii; and

1 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this body urges all relevant
2 state and county agencies, departments, and governing bodies to
3 adopt this recognition and ensure that open water lifeguards are
4 afforded the rights, resources, training support, and
5 professional respect accorded to first responders; and

7 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this body encourages continued
8 collaboration among public safety agencies to strengthen
9 emergency response capabilities and enhance safety across the
10 State's ocean, shoreline, and public environments; and

12 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
13 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Mayors of the
14 Counties of Kauai, Maui, and Hawaii and the City and County of
15 Honolulu; Chief of the Ocean Safety Division of the Department
16 of Fire and Public Safety of the County of Maui; Chief of the
17 Ocean Safety Bureau of the Kauai Fire Department; Chief of the
18 Ocean Safety Department of the City and County of Honolulu;
19 Chief of the Ocean Safety Bureau of the Hawai'i Fire Department;
20 Fire Chief of the Hawai'i Fire Department; Fire Chief of the
21 Kauai Fire Department; Fire Chief of the Fire and Public Safety
22 Department of the County of Maui; and Fire Chief of the Honolulu
23 Fire Department.
