
HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION, DEPARTMENT OF
EDUCATION, AND CITY AND COUNTY OF HONOLULU TO ENSURE THE
SAFETY OF MILILANI 'IKE ELEMENTARY STUDENTS USING SCHOOL
CROSSWALKS.

1 WHEREAS, the Department of Transportation reported one
2 hundred and twenty-nine traffic fatalities statewide in 2025,
3 the highest since 2007; and
4

5 WHEREAS, the one hundred and twenty-nine traffic fatalities
6 were a combination of motor vehicle occupants, pedestrians,
7 motorcyclists, scooter riders, bicyclists, and people riding
8 non-traditional conveyances; and
9

10 WHEREAS, pedestrian fatalities are a significant concern in
11 Hawaii, with thirty-eight deaths recorded in 2025; and
12

13 WHEREAS, the United States Department of Transportation
14 Federal Highway Administration recommends implementing
15 visibility enhancements, such as signage and lighting, in high
16 traffic areas where standard crosswalks are insufficient; and
17

18 WHEREAS, implementing speed bumps can lead to a forty
19 percent reduction in speed, leading to a sixty percent reduced
20 risk of automobile injury or death; and
21

22 WHEREAS, Mehe'ula Parkway serves as a main thoroughfare
23 through Mililani, extending to Mililani Mauka, resulting in
24 increased traffic and potentially dangerous speeds; and

26 WHEREAS, Mililani 'Ike Elementary School features a
27 particularly dangerous crosswalk in a high traffic area
28 intersecting Kuao'a Street and Mehe'ula Parkway; and

2 WHEREAS, while in the crosswalk, residents have experienced
3 near pedestrian accidents particularly for families crossing the
4 street before and after school; and

5
6 WHEREAS, while the crosswalk features painted stripes and
7 some signage, these measures are insufficient to protect against
8 the dangers of the road; and

9
10 WHEREAS, Mililani 'Ike Elementary School's Mehe'ula Parkway
11 and Kuao'a Street crosswalk could significantly benefit from the
12 visibility enhancement measures recommended by the federal
13 Department of Transportation; now, therefore,

14
15 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the
16 Thirty-third Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session
17 of 2026, the Senate concurring, that the Department of
18 Transportation, Department of Education, and City and County of
19 Honolulu are urged to ensure the safety of Mililani 'Ike
20 Elementary students using school crosswalks; and

21
22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Department of
23 Transportation, Department of Education, and City and County of
24 Honolulu are urged to implement more visibility enhancement
25 measures on the Mehe'ula Parkway and Kuao'a Street crosswalk at
26 Mililani 'Ike Elementary School; and

27
28 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that warning signage is requested to
29 be implemented on the road leading up to the crosswalk; and

30
31 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that speed bumps and corresponding
32 signage are requested to be constructed near the crosswalk to
33 encourage drivers to reduce their speed and warn them of
34 upcoming crossings; and

35
36 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a "STOP Here for Pedestrians"
37 sign is requested to be installed up to fifty feet in advance of
38 the crosswalk; and

40 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Mehe'ula Parkway and Kuao'a
41 Street intersection is requested to be outfitted with a solar-



1 powered, rapid flashing crosswalk sign to alert drivers of
2 pedestrians; and

4 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
5 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Director of
6 Transportation, Superintendent of Education, Chairperson of the
7 Board of Education, Mayor of the City and County of Honolulu,
8 and Honolulu City Councilmember representing District 8.
