# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE UNIFORM PROBATE CODE.

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:**

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that on January 19, 2020,  
2 two police officers were shot and killed while responding to an  
3 apparent landlord-tenant dispute in Honolulu. Although the  
4 suspected shooter was not a registered firearm owner in the  
5 State, the landlord of the property where the suspected shooter  
6 lived allegedly kept firearms belonging to the landlord's  
7 deceased husband at the property. The legislature further finds  
8 that these firearms, which may have been used in the fatal  
9 shooting, were not properly registered in the State and  
10 therefore were improperly possessed by the landowner.

11 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to require:

12 (1) A personal representative of a decedent appointed  
13 under the Uniform Probate Code to notify the police  
14 department of the appropriate county of any and all  
15 firearms in an estate; and



4 SECTION 2. Chapter 560, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is  
5 amended by adding a new section to article III to be  
6 appropriately designated and to read as follows:

7        "§560:3-        Firearms; notification; transfer or disposal.

8       (a) A personal representative shall notify the police  
9       department of the appropriate county of any and all firearms in  
10      an estate.


11                   (b) No estate shall close unless the police department of  
12                   the appropriate county certifies that all registered firearms in  
13                   the estate and other firearms of which the police department has  
14                   been notified are properly transferred or disposed of in  
15                   accordance with chapter 134."

**16** SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.

17 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

**Report Title:**

Uniform Probate Code; Firearms; Personal Representative

**Description:**

Requires a personal representative of a decedent appointed under the Uniform Probate Code to notify the police department of the appropriate county of any and all firearms in an estate.

Requires the police department to certify that all registered firearms in an estate and other firearms of which the police department has been notified are properly transferred or disposed of before the estate may close.
