
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the permit for the
2 Waimanalo Gulch Sanitary Landfill in Kapolei on Oahu expires in
3 2028.

4 The legislature also finds that the city and county of
5 Honolulu has not identified any sites for a new landfill that
6 the Honolulu board of water supply finds acceptable because the
7 sites identified are located above aquifers and therefore
8 development of a new landfill in those locations has the
9 potential to contaminate ground water.

10 The legislature further finds that the United States
11 Department of Defense holds that federal lands controlled by the
12 military are not available for landfill use under federal rules.
13 If no alternate landfill site is identified, the city and county
14 of Honolulu will be forced to pursue a legally prohibited
15 expansion of the Waimanalo Gulch Sanitary Landfill.

16 The legislature further finds that a new landfill on Oahu
17 is inherently problematic and is not necessarily the best way



1 that communities in the State can reduce and handle the solid
2 waste produced by their linear extract, package, and throw-away
3 economy.

4 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to establish a
5 temporary working group in the office of the governor to address
6 and inform policies and programs to reduce solid waste.

7 SECTION 2. (a) The governor shall convene a temporary
8 solid waste management working group, whose membership shall
9 comprise the following:

- 10 (1) A representative from the department of health;
- 11 (2) A representative from the department of environmental
12 services of the city and county of Honolulu;
- 13 (3) A representative from each county, as designated by
14 the mayor of that county;
- 15 (4) A representative from the Honolulu board of water
16 supply;
- 17 (5) A representative from the recycling industry, to be
18 invited by the governor;
- 19 (6) A representative from the composting industry, to be
20 invited by the governor;



- 1 (7) A representative from the reuse industry, to be
2 invited by the governor;
- 3 (8) A representative from the deconstruction industry, to
4 be invited by the governor;
- 5 (9) A representative from Zero Waste USA, to be invited by
6 the governor;
- 7 (10) A representative from a Hawaii-based environmental
8 nonprofit organization advocating for zero waste
9 priorities, to be invited by the governor;
- 10 (11) A landfill expert with specialization in landfill
11 liner leakage, to be invited by the governor;
- 12 (12) An expert in unit-based pricing, to be invited by the
13 governor;
- 14 (13) An expert in pyrolysis, to be invited by the governor;
- 15 (14) An expert in plasma arc gasification, to be invited by
16 the governor; and
- 17 (15) A representative from the United States Armed Forces,
18 to be invited by the governor.
- 19 (b) The first meeting of the solid waste management
20 working group shall be convened by the governor, or the
21 governor's designee. At the first meeting, the solid waste



1 management working group shall elect a chair from among its
2 members. The chair shall convene subsequent meetings of the
3 working group.

4 (c) The solid waste management working group shall submit
5 a report of its findings and recommendations, including any
6 proposed legislation, to the legislature no later than twenty
7 days prior to the convening of the regular session of 2027. The
8 report shall include:

9 (1) Information on materials management policies and
10 programs that reduce solid waste and protect the
11 environment, which includes the groundwater, earth,
12 and air; and

13 (2) A list of alternative technologies to address and
14 manage solid waste that cannot typically be recycled
15 or composted.

16 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050, and
17 shall be repealed on June 30, 2027.
