# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO VETERINARY MEDICINE.

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:**

1           SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to promote consumer  
2 choice, affordability, and transparency by ensuring that pet  
3 owners in the State have the right to obtain and fill  
4 prescriptions for their animals at a pharmacy of their choice.  
5 This Act is intended to remove barriers to competitive pricing,  
6 ensure fair access to veterinary medications, and enhance trust  
7 between veterinarians and their clients. This Act also seeks to  
8 protect consumer rights while maintaining safety and efficacy in  
9 the dispensing of pet medications. Additionally, this Act  
10 supports the integrity of veterinary practice by preserving the  
11 focus on medical care over retail functions and ensuring that  
12 veterinarians continue to play a central role in animal health  
13 management. Lastly, this Act furthers the State's commitment to  
14 consumer rights, affordability, and fair market competition by  
15 aligning with existing consumer protection laws and economic  
16 policies, such as statutes against unfair or deceptive acts and  
17 practices, which promote transparency and fairness in consumer



1 transactions and ensure pet owners, particularly those in rural  
2 or underserved areas, can access medications at reasonable costs  
3 while preserving high standards of veterinary care.

4 SECTION 2. Chapter 471, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is  
5 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated  
6 and to read as follows:

7 "§471- Requirements for written prescriptions. (a) A  
8 veterinarian shall, upon the request of a client, provide a  
9 written prescription for any medication prescribed for the  
10 client's animal patient without requiring the medication to be  
11 dispensed directly by the veterinarian.

12 (b) A veterinarian shall give notice to a client of the  
13 client's right to request a written prescription from the  
14 veterinarian and the option to have it filled at a pharmacy of  
15 the client's choice; provided that the notice may be given via  
16 direct communication, posted signage, or digital communication.

17 (c) No veterinarian shall issue a written prescription  
18 without the prior establishment of a veterinarian-client-patient  
19 relationship, which shall require that a veterinarian has  
20 conducted a timely examination of the animal or has made  
21 medically appropriate visits to the premises where the animal is



1 kept. A veterinarian with an existing veterinarian-client-  
2 patient relationship shall also have sufficient knowledge of the  
3 animal's health to make an informed medical judgment and ensure  
4 the availability of follow-up care as needed.

5 (d) A written prescription shall contain all of the  
6 following information:

7 (1) The name and address of the prescribing veterinarian;

8 (2) The name and species of the animal patient;

9 (3) The name, strength, and quantity of the prescribed  
10 medication;

11 (4) Directions for use;

12 (5) The date of issuance; and

13 (6) The veterinarian's signature or equivalent.

14 (e) Any pharmacy duly licensed in the State may dispense  
15 the medication prescribed by a licensed veterinarian pursuant to  
16 this section; provided that all state and federal certification  
17 requirements for handling and dispensing veterinary  
18 pharmaceuticals are met.

19 (f) Any veterinarian providing a written prescription  
20 shall not be held:



1       (1) Responsible for the improper storage, potential  
2       counterfeiting, medication substitution, or dosage  
3       errors that may be associated with dispensing from a  
4       third-party pharmacy; or

5       (2) Liable for any adverse effects or lack of efficacy in  
6       treatment due to externally sourced products.

7       (g) Any veterinarian who violates or fails to comply with  
8       this section shall be deemed to have engaged in professional  
9       misconduct and may be subject to disciplinary action by the  
10      board pursuant to section 471-10, which may include fines, the  
11      suspension or revocation of a license, or both.

12      (h) For the purposes of this section, "prescription" means  
13      a written order for medication issued by a veterinarian licensed  
14      in the State for the treatment of an animal."

15      SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.

16      SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 3000.



**Report Title:**

Equality Caucus; Hawaii Board of Veterinary Medicine; Veterinary Medicine; Veterinarian-Client-Patient Relationship; Pet Medication; Consumer Prescription Choice

**Description:**

Requires veterinarians to provide a written prescription, upon the request of a client, for any animal patient of a client with whom the veterinarian has established an existing veterinarian-client-patient relationship, to be filled at the pharmacy of the client's choosing. Allows pharmacies licensed in the State to dispense medications prescribed by veterinarians. Authorizes the Hawaii Board of Veterinary Medicine to establish penalties, which may include fines or suspension or revocation of a license. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)
