
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that kindergarten
2 assessments are intended to support early learning and inform
3 instruction in a developmentally appropriate manner. The
4 legislature further finds that children require sufficient time
5 to adjust to the kindergarten environment before meaningful
6 assessments can occur.

7 The legislature also finds that kindergarten teachers,
8 through sustained daily interaction with students, are best
9 positioned to conduct accurate, holistic assessments of a
10 child's development and learning needs. The original intent of
11 kindergarten assessments was to support classroom instruction
12 and family engagement, not to impose high-cost, externally
13 developed assessment systems, or burdensome training
14 requirements on teachers.

15 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to revise the
16 practice of kindergarten assessments to clarify legislative
17 intent, restore teacher-led assessment practices, reduce



unnecessary administrative and financial burdens, and ensure that kindergarten assessments remain developmentally appropriate and instructionally focused.

SECTION 2. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by adding a new section to part IV, subpart C, to be appropriately designated and to read as follows:

"§302A- Kindergarten assessments. (a) Each kindergarten teacher shall conduct a kindergarten assessment for each child in the teacher's class.

(b) The kindergarten assessment shall:

(1) Assess each child in a developmentally appropriate manner to support instruction and student learning;

(2) Consist of a general, observational assessment of the child's development and school readiness, including but not limited to:

(A) Language and early literacy development;

(B) Cognitive and problem-solving skills;

(C) Social and emotional development;

(D) Physical development; and



1 (E) Whether the child attended preschool or another
2 early learning program before entering
3 kindergarten; and

4 (3) Be administered in two parts; provided that:

5 (A) The first assessment shall be completed within
6 two months of each child's admission into
7 kindergarten; and

8 (B) The second assessment shall be completed within
9 the eighth month of the school year.

10 (c) Information obtained from the kindergarten assessments
11 shall be used only for:

12 (1) Instructional planning;

13 (2) Identifying student support needs; and

14 (3) Communication with parents or guardians.

15 Information obtained from the kindergarten assessments shall not
16 be used for student retention, high-stakes accountability,
17 school ranking, or teacher evaluation purposes.

18 (d) Kindergarten assessments shall not require the use of
19 commercially developed, standardized, or externally contracted
20 assessment instruments. Kindergarten teachers shall not be
21 required to complete any mandatory external certification or



1 training, beyond the standard kindergarten teacher training
2 required by the department, to administer kindergarten
3 assessments.

4 (e) The board may adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91 to
5 carry out the purposes of this section; provided that any rules
6 adopted pursuant to this subsection shall preserve the
7 professional judgement and discretion of kindergarten teachers."

8 SECTION 3. Section 302D-37, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
9 amended to read as follows:

10 **"§302D-37 Standardized assessment for students entering**
11 **kindergarten.** (a) The commission shall ~~[adopt the kindergarten~~
12 ~~entry assessment adopted by the board pursuant to section 302A-~~
13 ~~1165(a) to assess all charter school students entering~~
14 ~~kindergarten within the first thirty days of admission into~~
15 ~~kindergarten.~~

16 ~~(b) The commission may waive the requirements of the~~

18 ~~(c) The commission shall share the information gathered~~

6 SECTION 4. Section 346-186, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
7 amended by amending subsections (a) and (b) to read as follows:

8 "(a) The department shall establish or augment an existing
9 database to collect and analyze information it receives from the
10 department of education pursuant to [~~sections 302A-1165 and~~]
11 section 302A-1166 and the state public charter school commission
12 pursuant to [~~sections 302D-37 and~~] section 302D-38 and any other
13 information the department may collect on all children in the
14 State who are three to four years old and children who will not
15 be at least five years of age on or before July 31 of the
16 current school year.

17 (b) To the extent not prohibited by administrative rule or
18 law, the department, department of education, state public
19 charter school commission, and executive office on early
20 learning shall share any information gathered pursuant to
21 sections [~~302A-1165,~~] 302A-1166[~~, 302D-37,~~] and 302D-38 with



1 each other, along with any other information the department,
2 department of education, or state public charter school
3 commission may collect on all children in the State who are
4 three to four years old and children who will not be at least
5 five years of age on or before July 31 of the current school
6 year."

7 SECTION 5. Section 302A-1165, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
8 repealed.
