SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE COUNTY OF HAWAII AND CITY AND COUNTY OF HONOLULU TO
ADOPT ORDINANCES BANNING THE SALE, RENTAL, AND DISTRIBUTION
OF DISPOSABLE BODYBOARDS.

1 WHEREAS, disposable bodyboards are often comprised of
2 polystyrene, also known as Styrofoam, which once broken during
3 use or discarded, can quickly disintegrate, leaving behind
4 plastic foam that can pollute the State's reefs, shoreline, and
5 marine ecosystems; and

7 WHEREAS, in 2022, Maui County adopted an ordinance banning
8 the sale, rental, and distribution of polystyrene bodyboards to
9 limit the number of bodyboards discarded on beaches after only
10 being used a few times; and

11
12 WHEREAS, recently, the Kauai County Council also
13 unanimously adopted an ordinance banning the sale, rental, and
14 distribution of these disposable polystyrene foam bodyboards to
15 reflect their commitment to maintaining Kauai's unique marine
16 environment; and

18 WHEREAS, disposable bodyboard bans across all counties of
19 the State would more comprehensively help reduce waste, support
20 responsible tourism, and promote a smaller environmental
21 footprint; now, therefore,

23 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-third
24 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2026, the
25 House of Representatives concurring, that the County of Hawaii
26 and City and County of Honolulu are urged to adopt ordinances
27 banning the sale, rental, and distribution of disposable
28 bodyboards; and

30 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
