SENATE RESOLUTION

SUPPORTING THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE RECOMMENDATIONS FROM ALL
CYCLES OF THE UNIVERSAL PERIODIC REVIEW BY THE UNITED
NATIONS HUMAN RIGHTS COUNCIL, WHERE APPLICABLE TO THE
STATE.

1 WHEREAS, human rights and fundamental freedom are core
2 values of the United States of America and the global community;
3 and
4

5 WHEREAS, the United Nations is rooted in universal human
6 rights; and
7

8 WHEREAS, the Universal Periodic Review is a process through
9 which all United Nations member states review each other's human
10 rights records; and
11

12 WHEREAS, the Universal Periodic Review is an important
13 opportunity to organize in one's community, classroom, and
14 global civil society to realize human rights for all people; and
15

16 WHEREAS, the United Nations Human Rights Council has
17 scheduled the United States to be reviewed in November, 2026;
18 and

20 WHEREAS, the Universal Periodic Review provides for
21 participatory engagement in public policy and provides a vision
22 for the future of the nation; and

24 WHEREAS, the Universal Periodic Review creates a chance to
25 rejuvenate a culture of human rights across the country where
26 every voice can contribute to creative campaigns for positive
27 change for all; and
28

29 WHEREAS, the Universal Periodic Review allows for a broad
30 discussion and dialogue regarding holistic human rights
31 guaranteeing individual dignity and collective equality; and

33 WHEREAS, on November 5, 2010, the United States underwent
34 the first ever Universal Periodic Review of its human rights



1 record before the United Nations Human Rights Council in Geneva;
2 and

4 WHEREAS, the United States completed its second Universal
5 Periodic Review at the United Nations Human Rights Council at
6 the Palace of Nations in Geneva on May 11, 2015; and

7
8 WHEREAS, the most recent Universal Periodic Review covered
9 major concerns and campaigns to achieve the article of the
10 United Nations Charter and the Universal Declaration of Human
11 Rights, with the third cycle taking place on November 9, 2020;
12 and

14 WHEREAS, the review process provided an opportunity for the
15 United States to identify human rights violations, develop
16 solutions, and bring policies in line with international human
17 rights standards; and

18
19 WHEREAS, the recommendations from the three cycles of the
20 Universal Periodic Review provided insight into the major human
21 rights issues in the United States; and

22
23 WHEREAS, the recommendations from the most recent fourth
24 cycle can be reviewed and examined to be realized in the State;
25 and

26
27 WHEREAS, the human rights recommendations are also matched
28 with the 2030 United Nations Agenda, linking each recommendation
29 with the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals and
30 covering the seventeen global goals on the ground in the
31 nation's communities and state capitals; and

33 WHEREAS, local and state officials across the United States
34 have begun to take the lead to utilize the Universal Periodic
35 Review as a positive tool to transform their communities; and

37 WHEREAS, many civil society associations and
38 non-governmental organizations in the State participated in the
39 preparation of stakeholder reports and hosted community
40 dialogues for the Universal Periodic Review of the United
41 States; and

1 WHEREAS, a majority of the recommendations were taken
2 directly from civil society stakeholder reports and subsequent
3 study sheets that United Nations members used in the review
4 process; and

5
6 WHEREAS, the recommendations from all four cycles provided
7 basis for basic human rights in the State; now, therefore,

8
9 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-third
10 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2026,
11 that the Legislature supports the implementation of the
12 recommendations from all cycles of the Universal Periodic Review
13 by the United Nations Human Rights Council, where applicable to
14 the State; and

15
16 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislature supports the
17 promotion of a culture of human rights based on the principles
18 established in the Charter of the United Nations; and

19
20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislature encourages the
21 greater participation in United Nations human rights,
22 sustainable development, climate processes promoting rights and
23 fundamental freedoms, and protecting the planet; and

24
25 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
26 Resolution be transmitted to the Secretary-General of the United
27 Nations, High Commissioner for Human Rights of the United
28 Nations, and members of Hawai'i's congressional delegation.
