Your Committee reviewed the personal history, resume, and statement submitted by Brandon Rabang for service on the Board of Pharmacy.

Your Committee received testimony in support of the nomination for the reappointment of Brandon Rabang from the Board of Pharmacy and two individuals.

Upon review of the testimony, your Committee finds that Mr. Rabang's knowledge and proven experience on the Board of Pharmacy qualify him for reappointment to the Board as a public member. Your Committee notes that Mr. Rabang has over twenty years of experience in the pharmaceutical industry. Mr. Rabang has worked for Janssen Pharmaceutical Inc., a subsidiary of Johnson & Johnson, since 2003, progressing from his initial role as a Primary Care Sales Representative through numerous managerial roles to his current position as Executive Hospital Account Specialist, where he is responsible for partnering with health care customers to ensure residents of the State have access to live-saving medications. 
