Sir:

Your Committee on Commerce and Consumer Protection, to which was referred S.B. No. 3248, S.D. 1, entitled:

"A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO LABELING REQUIREMENTS,"

begs leave to report as follows:

The purpose and intent of this measure is to establish labeling requirements for 'ōkolehao products.

Your Committee received testimony in support of this measure from the Department of Agriculture and Biosecurity, one member of the Hawai'i County Council, Hawai'i Farm Bureau, Ola Brew, and nine individuals.

Your Committee received testimony in opposition to this measure from Kahuna Spirits Ltd. and three individuals.

Your Committee finds that 'ōkolehao is a traditional Hawaiian distilled spirit with historical and cultural significance. Establishing labeling requirements for 'ōkolehao products can benefit farmers, distillers, distributors, and retailers in the State to create an authentic visitor experience rooted in culture and place. This measure would regulate the traditional Hawaiian name and support local industry to further develop 'ōkolehao as a regionally distinctive product.



Your Committee has amended this measure by making technical, nonsubstantive amendments for the purposes of clarity and consistency.

As affirmed by the record of votes of the members of your Committee on Commerce and Consumer Protection that is attached to this report, your Committee is in accord with the intent and purpose of S.B. No. 3248, S.D. 1, as amended herein, and recommends that it pass Third Reading in the form attached hereto as S.B. No. 3248, S.D. 2.
