RELATING TO DECEPTIVE PRACTICES.

CPC, FIN

Requires merchants that sell cosmetics to accept returns of new or unopened goods within specified timeframes. Clarifies the definition of "conspicuous sign" and expands required placement of return and refund policy signage. Beginning 7/1/2027, requires merchants that receive three or more warning letters from the Office of Consumer Protection for failure to post required signage to display standardized return and refund policy signs provided by the Office. Establishes exemptions for certain merchants. Appropriates funds.

RELATING TO COUNTY LABOR STANDARDS.

LAB, CPC, JHA

Authorizes the counties to require contractors to disclose information regarding their employees' wages, benefits, hours, and employment status and deny, revoke, or suspend a building permit application for violating laws relating to wages, benefits, hours, and employment status, under certain conditions. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)



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| <u>HB 1704, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR49-26)</u> <u>Status</u> | RELATING TO THE PSYCHOLOGY INTERJURISDICTIONAL COMPACT. Adopts the Psychology Interjurisdictional Compact to regulate the practice of telepsychology and temporary in-person, face-to-face practice of psychology by psychologists across state boundaries in the performance of their psychological practice. Requires the Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs to adopt rules to implement and administer the compact. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1) | HLT, CPC, JHA |
| <u>HB 1563, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR56-26)</u> <u>Status</u> | RELATING TO TOBACCO PRODUCTS. Repeals the preemption on county ordinances that regulate the sale of cigarettes, tobacco products, and electronic smoking devices. Allows counties to adopt ordinances that regulate the sale of cigarettes, tobacco products, and electronic smoking devices that do not conflict with and are more stringent than the state law that governs smoking. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1) | HLT, CPC, FIN |
| <u>HB 1573, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR45-26)</u> <u>Status</u> | RELATING TO HEALTH. Requires electronic smoking device and e-liquid manufacturers to certify to the Department of Attorney General annually that the manufacturer received a Marketing Granted Order from the federal Food and Drug Administration and that the manufacturer is in compliance with federal regulations and state laws. Requires the Department to compile and make public a directory of all electronic smoking device and e-liquid manufacturers and products duly certified. Establishes penalties for manufacturers that fail to comply with the certification requirements and for other parties that sell products that are not in the directory. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1) | HLT, CPC, JHA |
| <u>HB 1777, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR115-26)</u> <u>Status</u> | RELATING TO HOUSING. Requires developers developing a housing project under the Hawaii Housing Finance and Development Corporation to assist certain tenants who are subject to displacement or eviction by the proposed project by: granting those tenants the right of first offer of a comparable unit in the housing project and providing replacement housing payments; providing information, either directly or through a contracted service, on how to obtain assistance and exercise the right of first offer; and establishing procedures to track and maintain communication with those tenants. Establishes consequences for a developer's noncompliance. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1) | HSG, CPC, JHA |
| <u>HB 1749, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR14-26)</u> <u>Status</u> | RELATING TO CESSPOOLS. Beginning 1/1/2027, requires sellers to provide buyers with a wastewater system disclosure form before the execution of a real estate purchase contract. Requires the Department of Health and Real Estate Commission to develop a standardized wastewater system disclosure form by 11/1/2026. Establishes penalties. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1) | EEP, CPC, FIN |

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW
