<a href="#">SB 2936</a> <a href="#">Status &amp; Testimony</a>	RELATING TO PARKING FOR DISABLED PERSONS. Beginning 7/1/27, increases the number of required accessible and van accessible parking spaces in parking lots with more than twenty-five parking spaces that are covered by title II or III of the Americans with Disabilities Act.	HHS/TRS, WAM
<a href="#">SB 2850</a> <a href="#">Status &amp; Testimony</a>	RELATING TO PARKING FOR PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES. Provides that people who are blind or deaf are eligible to apply for and receive a disabled paid parking permit.	TRS/HHS, JDC
<a href="#">SB 2851</a> <a href="#">Status &amp; Testimony</a>	RELATING TO DEAF INDIVIDUALS. Authorizes deaf motor vehicle owners to register their vehicle as being owned by a deaf individual so that a deafness designation appears when a law enforcement officer accesses the motor vehicle's information.	TRS/HHS, JDC
<a href="#">SB 2521</a> <a href="#">Status &amp; Testimony</a>	RELATING TO EMERGENCY SERVICES. Exempts emergency medical services personnel from commercial driver's license requirements. Amends the definition of "authorized emergency vehicle" under State Traffic Code to replace ambulances with emergency medical services vehicles.	TRS/HHS, JDC
