Authorizes the Adjutant General to expand the Hawaii National  
Guard State Tuition Assistance Program to include graduate  
degrees at the University of Hawaii for qualified enlisted  
personnel in the Hawaii National Guard.

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

EDU/PSM, WAM

Authorizes the Department of Education to award a high school  
diploma to qualified persons who did not receive a high school  
diploma as a result of compulsory or voluntary induction into the  
Armed Services of the United States or whose high school  
education was interrupted due to wartime practices during World  
War II, the Korean War, or the Vietnam War.

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

EDU/PSM, WAM

Requires the Department of Education to develop and  
implement a 100th Infantry Battalion history curricula plan  
beginning with the 2027-2028 school year. Establishes a one-  
year 100th Infantry Battalion history curriculum pilot program  
within certain public high schools during the 2026-2027 school  
year. Requires a report to the Legislature.

Decision Making to follow, if time permits.
