Amends the expungement orders law to reflect that a person who is arrested for or charged with a crime but convicted of a violation is eligible for an expungement of their arrest record for that incident. (HD1)	PSM, JDC
<a href="#">HB 2289, HD1</a> <a href="#">(HSCR870-26)</a> <a href="#">Status &amp; Testimony</a>	RELATING TO THE EXPENDITURE CEILING ON THE AUTOMATED VICTIM INFORMATION AND NOTIFICATION SYSTEM SPECIAL FUND. Repeals the \$600,000 annual expenditure ceiling on the Automated Victim Information and Notification System Special Fund to address rising program costs and growing victim service demands. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)	PSM, WAM
<a href="#">HB 2413, HD1</a> <a href="#">(HSCR916-26)</a> <a href="#">Status &amp; Testimony</a>	RELATING TO PRETRIAL REFORM. Requires release on recognizance for defendants charged with violations, traffic offenses, nonviolent petty misdemeanors, nonviolent misdemeanors, and nonviolent class C felonies, subject to conditions. Establishes exclusions for specified offenses, threats to public safety, and certain other circumstances. Requires findings when bail or detention is imposed, ongoing review of continued detention or conditions, and a prompt hearing if bail cannot be posted. Requires prosecutors to notify victims of pretrial decisions. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)	PSM, JDC

- Testifiers for this hearing will be limited to **2 minutes** each.
