Mission Statement, Strategic Objectives, and Goals

Legal Services

As detailed in its annual report of *Goals and Objective of the Department of the Attorney General*, the mission of the Department is to provide excellent legal services to the State of Hawai'i by offering advice and counsel to its client agencies, assisting in the implementation of policy decisions, aiding the core activities of its client agencies, representing the State and its agencies and officers in litigation, and investigating and prosecuting human trafficking, white collar crime, criminal violations by public officials and employees, and crimes that occur on public lands and properties. Carrying out this mission includes: (1) initiating lawsuits to protect the interests of consumers, and appearing for the State in civil and criminal cases when the State is a party, (2) investigating violations of state laws and enforcing them in criminal and civil actions, (3) preparing legal opinions for the Governor, Legislature, and the heads of state departments, (4) assisting with the preparation of the Administration's bill package for each legislative session, reviewing all bills that are introduced each session, and advising the Legislature and the Governor about legal concerns with those bills and other legislative matters, (5) advising state officials, including more than 170 boards and commissions, on legal matters so they can faithfully execute their duties and responsibilities, (6) defending and representing state officials and employees when they are sued for actions that have occurred as part of their official duties; (7) collaborating with federal, state, and county law enforcement agencies in the Hawai'i High Intensity Drug Trafficking Area organization to disrupt drug trafficking operations, and (8)

collaborating with other states, as well as federal and local counterparts, on matters of importance to our State.

The Department's broad goals are to enhance operations, functionality, and professionalism by maintaining an environment that attracts and nurtures talented attorneys and individuals with a commitment to public service, so that the Department can continue to represent the State successfully at the local and federal level on matters of state importance.

The Department's specific goals and objectives are to:

1. Sustain Quality Legal Services through Hiring and Training
2. New Deputy Training
3. Improve Range of Legal Services by Cross Training
4. Adapt to the Changing Needs of the Workforce
5. Recruit and Retain Workers with Young Children by Offering Childcare Options
6. Share and Access Resources; Establish a Data Bank
7. Reduce Time Spent on Non-Legal Tasks
8. Improve Client Relations
9. Succession Planning and Leadership Opportunities

Crime Prevention and Justice Assistance Division (CPJAD)

The mission of the CPJAD is to serve as the central agency to provide the Attorney General with the information and resources needed to address crime and crime prevention, specifically by: (1) researching crime issues and reporting comprehensive crime statistics for the State; (2) utilizing federal and state funds and non-financial resources to address crime problems and criminal justice system issues; (3) planning, developing, and implementing education and crime prevention programs to promote community involvement in crime prevention efforts; (4) developing and maintaining a computerized juvenile offender information system; (5) assisting in locating, recovering, and reuniting missing children and runaways with their families; and supporting the Hawai'i Sexual Assault Response and Training program and the statewide standards for responding to sexual assaults.

Specific goals and objectives of the CPJAD are to:

1. Continue the administration of federal grant award monies awarded to the Department
2. Continue to engage in community outreach and education through presentations and small community events
3. Continue to locate, recover, and reunify missing children

Hawai'i Criminal Justice Data Center (HCJDC)

The mission of the HCJDC is to provide the highest quality identification services and criminal justice information to authorized criminal justice and non-criminal justice agencies, as permitted by State statute. The HCJDC fulfills this mission through its responsibility over the adult statewide criminal history repository, collection, access, and dissemination of criminal history information, the statewide Automated Biometric Identification System that includes the statewide Automated Fingerprint Identification System, the statewide mug photo and facial recognition systems, and the statewide sex offender registry. The HCJDC also serves as the State's Information Bureau and liaison to the Federal Bureau of Investigation's National Crime Information Center program.

Specific goals and objectives of the HCJDC are to:

1. Establish a robust disaster recovery infrastructure
2. Enhance security
3. Improve the performance and efficiency of criminal history systems

Child Support Enforcement Agency (CSEA)

The mission of the CSEA is to aid children and families by collecting, disbursing, and enforcing support payments (both financial and medical) owed to custodial parents. The agency promotes the well-being of children and the self-sufficiency of families through the timely and effective operation of its responsibilities while providing excellence in customer service.

Specific goals and objectives for the CSEA in the upcoming fiscal year (FY) are to:

1. Complete and implement a successful system replatform
2. Continue the consistent collection of child support payments and disbursement to families

Performance Metrics

Legal Services

The Department's performance measures rarely change because they are so closely tied

to the successful representation of its clients. Currently, the Department's performance measures are tied to variable factors such as the number of cases tried or settled, number of legislative bills reviewed, number of contracts or administrative rules reviewed, number of investigations completed, and the number of hours spent associated with these metrics.

Hawai'i Criminal Justice Data Center

Performance measures for the HCJDC include the average number of days to complete the expungement process, percent of eligible registered sex offenders, average number of days to complete criminal background checks, etc.

Child Support Enforcement Agency

The CSEA is strictly regulated for federal compliance standards by the federal Office of Child Support on an annual basis. The CSEA's performance measures are tied to five specific categories monitored by the federal government. These categories are:

1. Paternity establishment
2. Collection of current support
3. Collection of arrears
4. Order establishment
5. Cost effectiveness

The Department of Budget and Finance (B&F) permits changes to a department's performance metrics during budget preparation for a biennium, thus the next opportunity to revise performance metrics will be for FB 2027 – 2029. In the interim the Administrative Services Manager (ASM) has been tasked to work with the Department's legal and public service divisions to conduct a comprehensive review of current performance metrics to assess their relevance, applicability, and ability to be quantified. Upon completion, the Department may amend its metrics by adding, removing, or amending its performance measures at the appropriate time designated by B&F. The Department's goal is to ensure performance measures accurately reflect the Department's activities, are items that can be tracked, and ultimately support the Department's mission and purpose.

B. HOW CURRENT STATEWIDE ECONOMIC AND FISCAL CONDITIONS HAVE AFFECTED OPERATIONS AND THE ABILITY TO MEET GOALS

Legal Services

Through a combination of generous appropriations by the Legislature for fiscal biennium 2025 – 2027 and careful resource management, the Department has not experienced

any adverse impacts from current statewide economic or fiscal conditions. As discussed in greater detail below, despite uncertainties at the federal level, the Department's own major federal funding awards were not put at risk. Though the Department remains alert to any future shifts in federal activity or direction that could impact its operations.

Despite reports of challenges in the job market, the Department is pleased to report it has made exceptional progress in reducing its departmental vacancies. Last session, as of 11/30/2024, the Department reported a total of 128 vacancies. This session, as of 11/30/2025, the Department had a total of 79 vacancies, of which 15 had a pending future start date bringing the Department's net vacancies to 64 positions: a 50% vacancy reduction. Of the Department's 95 civil service hires over the past year, 51 were hired through the normal state hiring process, 9 were hired through internal vacancy announcements, and 35 were hired through the Governor's Operation Hire Hawai'i initiative (OHHI).

This accomplishment was made possible through both the continued support of the Legislature and diligent participation in job fairs and other activities. Thanks to the Legislature's approval of \$2 million for fiscal biennium (FB) 2025 -2027 for salary adjustments for deputy attorney general (DAG) positions, the Department remains a competitive employer against both public and private sector agencies and firms. Last session the Department reported an average annual salary of \$111,016 for its DAGs based on FY 24 data from Civil Beat's online salary database; for FY 26 that average has increased to \$120,790. The ability to compensate DAGs at wages commensurate with their experience allows the Department to retain talented attorneys and quickly fill vacant DAG positions.

In FY 26, the Department participated at 11 job fairs throughout the state, took advantage of opportunities like OHHI and Wikiwiki Hire that expedite the state hiring process, and leveraged existing HR policies and practices such as flex hiring, reallocating positions, or redescribing positions to ensure that the Department's recruitment activity aligns with its organizational needs. The Department has also found success with utilizing the 89-day hire process to provide real-time job specific training for potential applicants while they apply for permanent positions.

The Department continues to collaborate with the University of Hawai'i system to present and speak with soon to be graduates from community college paralegal programs about career opportunities and is awaiting feedback from the Department of Human Resources Development on a proposal to update the Legal Assistant series to create a career ladder within the Department. The proposal would create an advanced Legal Assistant position for exceptionally qualified legal assistants in divisions whose scope of work is more complex and create an entry level Legal Assistant position that would serve as a pathway for Legal Clerks in bargaining unit 3 to promote into the professional series of bargaining unit 13. The Department also intends to be a more active participant in the Department of Labor's Hele Imua internship program.

Over the course of the year the Department has secured major litigation victories, many of which put to rest decades long cases such as *Dannenberg v. State of Hawai'i*, 06-1-1141-06 JPC, *Burke et al. V. Kakaako Land Company, State of Hawai'i, et al.*, 1CC141001912, and *Maunalua Bay Beach Ohana 28, et al. v. State of Hawai'i*, SCWC-19-0000776. Another major highlight of particular interest, given the State's current fiscal and economic condition, is the \$700 million settlement reached with Bristol-Meyers Squibb and Sanofi in *State of Hawai'i v. Bristol-Meyers Squibb Co., et al.*, Civ. No. 14-1-0708. After the payment of legal fees and costs, the State's net settlement proceeds total over \$550 million and will provide a much-needed financial buoy to the State general fund. Further details of this and other milestone litigation can be found in the Department's *Goals and Objective of the Department of the Attorney General* report.

In an effort to better communicate the Department's work, the Department hired a designated Public Information Officer in December of 2023. Since then, the Department has significantly increased its media presence and information sharing with the public. On December 10, 2025, the Department achieved a record 100 press releases in a single calendar year. These releases contained important consumer protection announcements and warnings, criminal indictments and judgments, and the state's participation in litigation as described in more detail below.

Looking ahead, the Department is cognizant of the economic challenges ahead. The University of Hawai'i Economic Research Organization has forecasted a mild recession for 2026, and the state is not immune from the changing federal landscape. At its current funding levels, the Department is confident that it can sustain operations and continue to deliver the level of quality legal and public services deserving of the people of Hawai'i.

Hawai'i Criminal Justice Data Center (HCJDC)

The HCJDC operations are funded by a combination of general, revolving, and federal funds. The Department carefully monitors the revenues and expenses of all three of these funding sources, as fluctuations in one source of funding could result in an additional burden to the other funding sources. Like other programs in ATG, vacancies were a challenge over the year, however, by participating in the Department's aggressive recruiting campaign, the HCJDC had only two vacancies as of 11/30/2025, with the division consisting of 47 total positions.

On average the HCJDC conducts an average of 5,000 civil fingerprint-based background checks per month, manages approximately 2,900 sex offender records, and maintains more than 645,000 adult criminal history records in the state repository.

Child Support Enforcement Agency (CSEA)

Recruitment and retention of civil service employees remain an ongoing challenge for the CSEA, though the agency has made considerable progress in reducing its total vacancies. Last year, as of 11/30/2024, the CSEA reported a total of 44 vacancies; as of 11/30/2025, the CSEA had a total number of 20 vacancies, a reduction of 45%. Recruitment on the neighbor islands is particularly challenging given smaller applicant pools, competing employers, and salary rates compared to neighbor island cost of living.

Despite these challenges, the CSEA collected over \$95 million in child support for FY 2024 -2025, 95% of which was distributed to families. The remaining share was distributed to the Department of Human Services as general funds, pursuant to section 567D-8, HRS. The CSEA also created and launched the CSEA Mobile App and CSEA Customer Portal, offering a more convenient and user-friendly way for customers to access case information anytime, from any device.

C. FEDERAL FUNDS

Since January 2025, the Department has sued the federal administration 35 times as part of a coalition of twenty-three attorney general offices throughout the country. Included in these lawsuits is litigation in direct response to the federal government's unlawful actions to terminate, freeze, or otherwise disrupt or deny access to Congressionally appropriated federal funds to the State of Hawai'i. The Department's efforts have resulted in orders that restored, among other money, approximately \$16 million in unlawfully frozen funds flowing to the State **per day**, as well as over \$500 million owed to the State from the Federal Emergency Management Agency, including over \$21 million for Hawaii's Disaster Case Management Program used to assist victims of the Maui wildfires. Additionally, the Department has worked diligently to keep more than \$365 million in federal transportation funds flowing without the imposition of illegal funding conditions, reinstate \$89 million in illegally terminated grants to the Hawai'i Department of Health, and restore \$33 million in funds to the Hawai'i Department of Education.

The Department remains committed to enforcing the rule of law and protecting the interests of the State and its citizens against federal actions that conflict with federal law and state law or the state constitution.

Impacts of federal funding, as it relates specifically to the Department, are explained below.

Legal Divisions

To date, federal funds received directly by the Department to supplement operational costs, such as those from the U.S. Department of Justice that support the State's

Internet Crimes Against Children (ICAC) Unit, continue to be available to the Department without interruption. In fact, the recent passage of the *Protect our Children Reauthorization Act of 2025* strengthens the ICAC Task Force Program nationwide, including increased funding for ICAC units and updates to the national strategy to prevent child exploitation.

Crime Prevention and Justice Assistance Division

Although federal funds continue to remain available for the CPJAD, the Department has identified that the Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) Victim Assistance Grant, CFDA 16.575, awarded by the U.S. Department of Justice, Office of Justice Programs, Office for Victims of Crime, is at risk for a reduction of federal funds.

The fluctuations in the federal funds received for the VOCA, Victim Assistance Grant have been significant over time. The Department's Victim Assistance grant amount in federal fiscal year (FFY) 2021 was \$4,783,838; in FFY 2022, the grant amount was \$6,547,786; in FFY 2023, the grant amount was \$6,156,448; in FFY 2024, the grant amount was \$3,688,853; and in FFY 2025, the grant amount is \$5,722,497. The table below reflects the change in the award amount from the preceding year by dollar and percentage.

VOCA funds are used to provide direct services to victims of crime. The Department passes through funds to the county prosecutors victim witness offices to support staff and respective subgrantees. The Department also awards funding to non-profit victim service providers through Chapter 103-F, Hawaii Revised Statutes. Services are defined as those efforts that: 1) respond to the emotional and physical needs of crime victims; 2) assist primary and secondary victims of crime to stabilize their lives after victimization; 3) assist victims of crime to understand and participate in the criminal justice system; or 4) provide victims of crime with a measure of safety and security.

Beginning FY 2024, the Legislature increased funding to support the Victim Witness Assistance Program (VW) established pursuant to section 28-11, HRS, to provide

information, assistance, and support services to the victims of and witnesses to crimes committed in the state. The Department passes through VW funds to the county prosecutors to support their respective victim witness offices. The VW amount increased from \$401,078 to \$1,375,015. This increase in VW funds has offset the VOCA reductions and provides some stability to the VOCA and VW funds awarded to the county prosecutors. Below is the combined VW and VOCA funding to the county prosecutors for State FY 25, 26, and 27.

There are no plans to supplant the reduction of VOCA grant funds with other funds for the current fiscal year (FY 26). For FY 27 there may be deobligated VOCA funding to provide the counties with additional/bridge funding. It is unclear when the reductions will slow or reverse. The Sustain the Crime Victims Fund Act of 2021 (VOCA Fix) enacted in July 2021 by President Biden permits the VOCA Victim Assistance Grant to allow state administering agencies a no-cost extension of up to one year per grant award to provide states with additional time to re-purpose or use available Victim Assistance funds that otherwise would lapse back to OVC.

If federal funding is reduced, the impact to the public may be a reduction to victim services.

Hawai'i Criminal Justice Data Center

Federal funding for the HCJDC continues to be available and there are currently no known risks to federal funds at this time. Federal funding is essential to supporting the operations of the HCJDC, specifically, criminal history systems supported by the National Criminal History Improvement Program (NCHIP), CFDA 16.554, enables the HCJDC to maintain its network infrastructure, network security, and hardware and software upkeep. As an example, the HCJDC's fingerprint system is due for an upcoming upgrade estimated at \$3 million. The Department will continue to closely monitor the availability of current and future federal funding for the HCJDC.

Child Support Enforcement Agency

Federal funding continues to be available to the CSEA on a 66:34 split, with federal funding covering 66% percent of the operating costs of the CSEA, and the remaining 34% covered by state general funds. During the federal government shutdown, the CSEA continued to have access to its federal matching funds without interruption. To date, there are no known changes at the federal government level that would adversely impact the CSEA's funding or operations. Nonetheless, the Department is closely monitoring activities and events in Washington D.C. that could impact agency operations in the future.

E. PROCESS TO DEVELOP AND PRIORITIZE BUDGET REQUESTS

The Department recognizes the State is at a financially significant juncture requiring prudent management of resources to weather short-term setbacks and ensure long-term sustainability. As such, the Department limited its budget requests only to those items deemed critical and necessary to its operations.

As in prior years, the Department's process to develop its budget began with a comparative review of past performance data that included actual vs. budgeted costs and expenditures, appropriation amounts lapsed in previous fiscal years, revenues earned in previous fiscal years, recruitment and retention activity, statutory changes, collective bargaining adjustments, and other operating variables. From this initial review, housekeeping adjustments were identified to true-up the Department's budget to better align with the Department's organizational structure.

During the first quarter of the FY, the ASM consulted with each of the Department's division supervisors to identify areas of need within their respective divisions. Requests by division supervisors were then carefully assessed to determine whether existing resources were sufficient or could otherwise be reallocated to address those areas of need. If it was determined that a particular request would require a formal budget ask, the ASM scheduled meetings with the requestor to discuss in greater detail the need for the budget request, the budget process, and how the request advances the Department's mission and purpose and provides for more effective and/or efficient operations.

Requests determined to require budgetary action were formalized on B&F Form As by the ASM in collaboration with division supervisors; the ASM then presented these

requests to the Attorney General (AG) and the First Deputy Attorney General (FDAG). Together, the AG, FDAG, and ASM review each request and decide whether to 1) approve the request as is, 2) approve the request with amendments, or 3) defer the request. Approved requests were then submitted to B&F for further review and recommendations to the Governor pursuant to the instructions provided in Finance Memorandum No. 25-13 dated September 12, 2025.

F. HOW SIGNIFICANT BUDGET REQUESTS ARE EXPECTED TO AFFECT OUTCOMES

Legal Division

1. Increase Budget Line-Item for Litigation Expenses

The Department requests an addition of \$1,000,000 of general funds to increase its line-item budget for litigation expenses.

ATG's line-item budget for litigation is used to fund all aspects of litigation costs and fees including, but not limited to expert witnesses, outside expert counsel, trial costs, filing fees, discovery costs, materials and supplies, witness fees and travel, attorney travel, court reporters, process servers, etc. In addition, there are indirect costs associated with litigation such as case and document management systems, subscription to legal research platforms, and litigation support software.

Act 250, SLH 2025, raised the Department's FY 26 line-item budget for litigation to \$5,000,000 by appropriating an additional \$3,000,000 of general funds; for FY 27 the Department was appropriated an additional \$1,000,000, raising the Department's FY 27 line-item budget for litigation to \$3,000,000. If approved, the requested \$1, 000,000 would increase the line-item budget for litigation for FY 27 to \$4,000,000.

Due to the unpredictable nature of litigation, it is difficult to project the Department's actual litigation costs on a year-to-year basis, however, a review of actual litigation expenditures from FY 23 to FY 25 indicates an upward trend in litigation costs. For FY 23 ATG expended a total of \$2,340,270.83 related to litigation, for FY 24 \$3,299,470.45, and for FY 25 \$3,229,295.59. For FY 26, as of December 17, 2025, the Department has expended \$1,343,682.10 of general funds on litigation. It is important to note that these figures do not include litigation costs that are funded directly by another state agency or litigation costs by which ATG was reimbursed by client agencies pursuant to a memorandum of agreement or understanding. Nor do these figures capture litigation expenses related to the August 2023 Maui wildfires which were previously funded using federal ARPA funds or trust funds.

Increasing the Department's litigation line-item will provide the necessary resources and capacity to ensure that ATG can respond to potential litigation expeditiously and afford the best representation and defense in matters involving the State. As earlier

highlighted, litigation is not always defensive and the Department's efforts in proactive litigation can save the State significant sums of money over the long term for an often-smaller upfront investment.

2. Add New Positions and Funds for the Law Enforcement Standards Board (LESB)

The LESB is requesting an additional 3.00 FTE positions and \$758,480 of general funds for FY 27 to increase its staffing and other operational capabilities to meet the mandate of Chapter 139, HRS. Specifically, the LESB is seeking to add an Administrative Manager, a Law Enforcement Training & Curriculum Coordinator, and a Lead Investigative Agent. Additionally, the LESB is seeking to add other current expenses for a learning management system, a job task analysis study, travel, and a certification system.

Currently the LESB operational budget consists of 2.00 FTE positions, an Administrator and a civil service Office Assistant IV, and \$3,000 of recurring general funds for other current expenses. The LESB hired its first Administrator on October 16, 2024, who has identified the requested positions and funding as fundamental to fulfilling the statutory mandate of Chapter 139, HRS. Securing funding to procure the requested studies and IT systems is critical for the LESB to establish and maintain law enforcement training programs and issue and maintain certifications for law enforcement officers as required by law.

Because HRS §139-7(a) provides that “no person shall be appointed or employed as a law enforcement officer by any county police department, the department of law enforcement, the department of land and natural resources, the department of taxation, or the department of the attorney general after June 30, 2026, unless the person possesses a valid certification issued by the board pursuant to section 139-6(b),” the outcome if this request is not approved is that no new law enforcement officers may be appointed or employed until the LESB can create the statutorily required certification. The Department is aware that a bill has been drafted to extend the effective date of Chapter 139, HRS, beyond June 30, 2026, to allow the LESB sufficient time to develop the requisite training and certification programs.

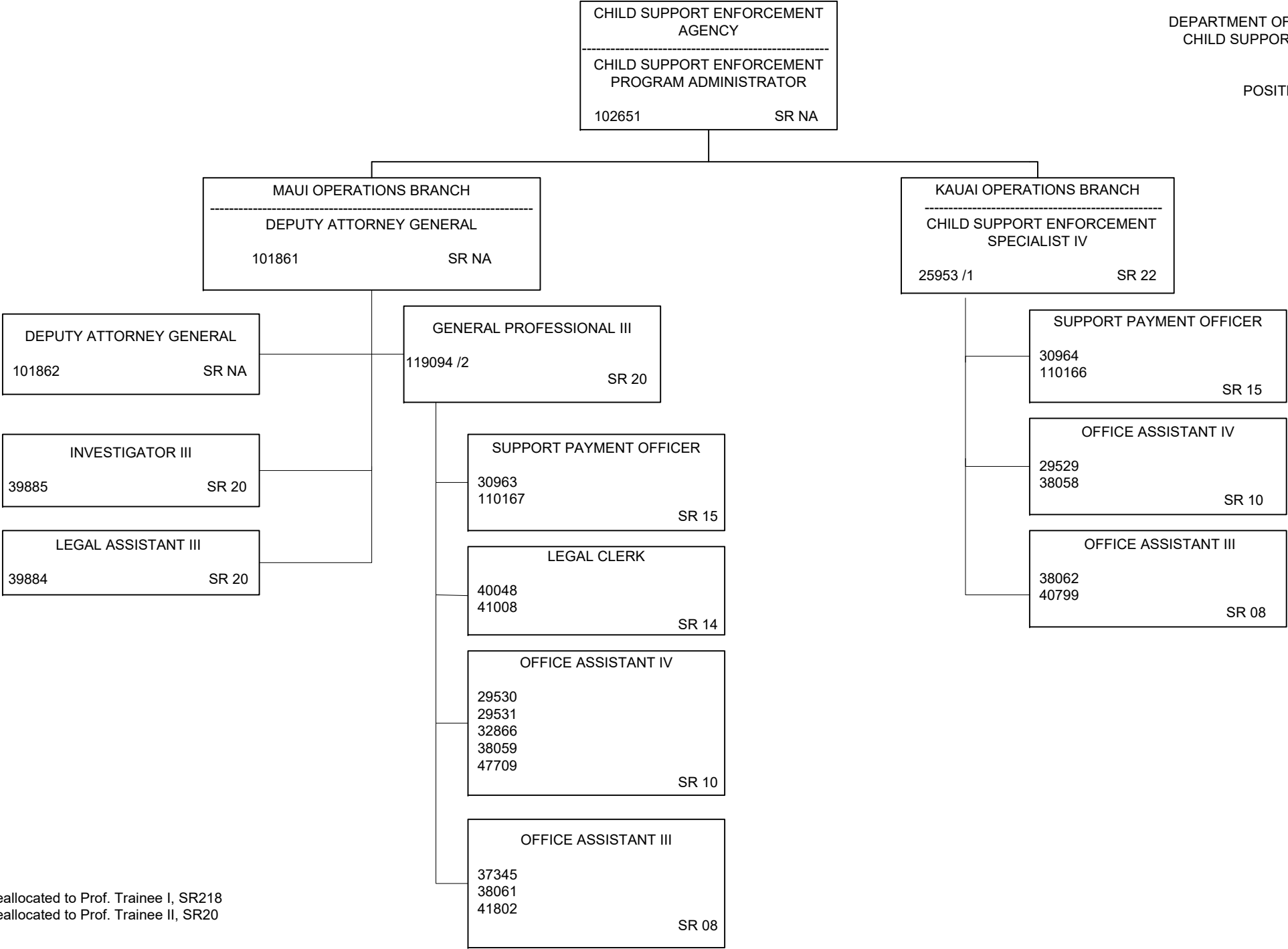


POSITION ORGANIZATION CHART

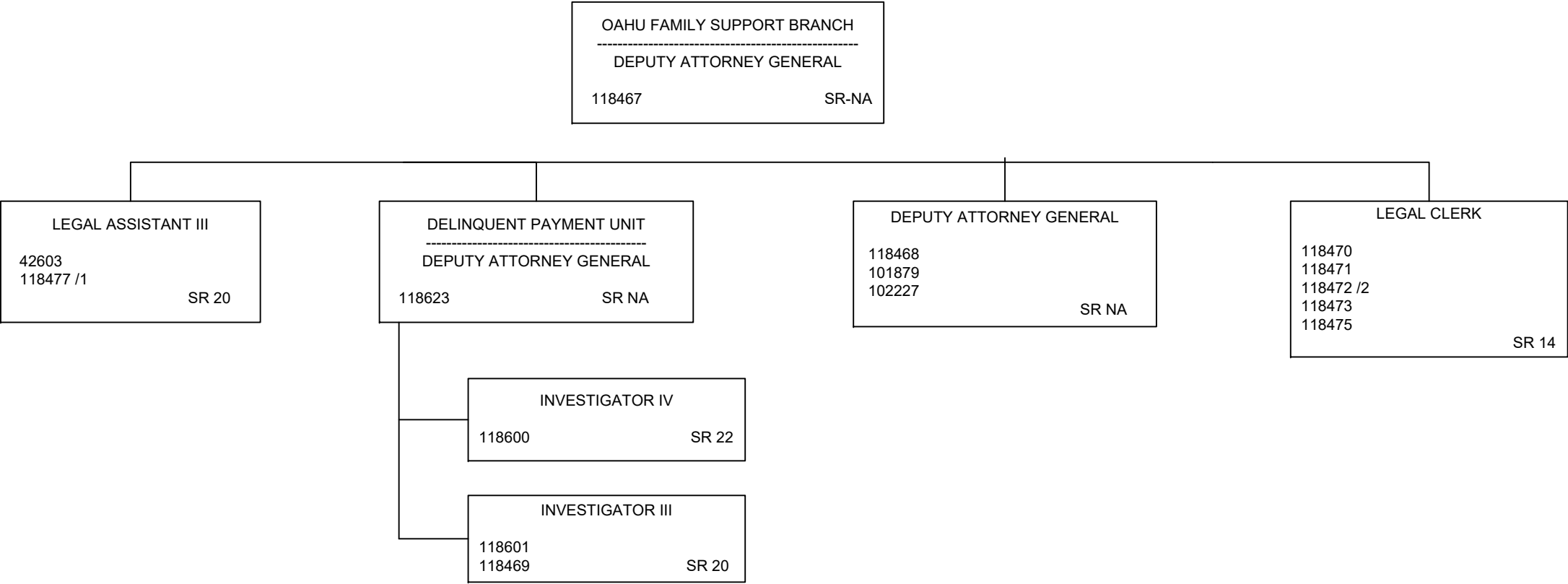

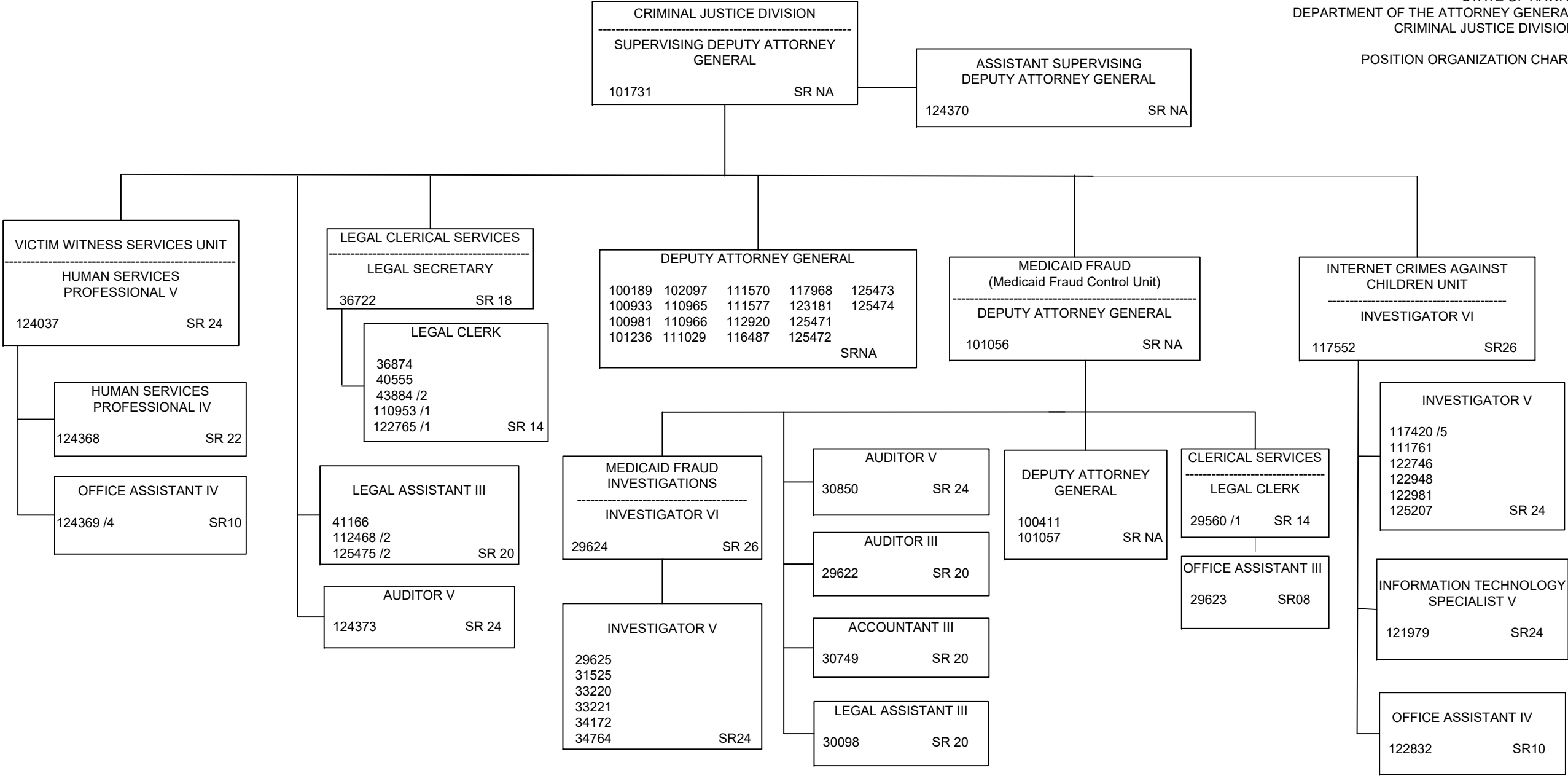
POSITION ORGANIZATION CHART



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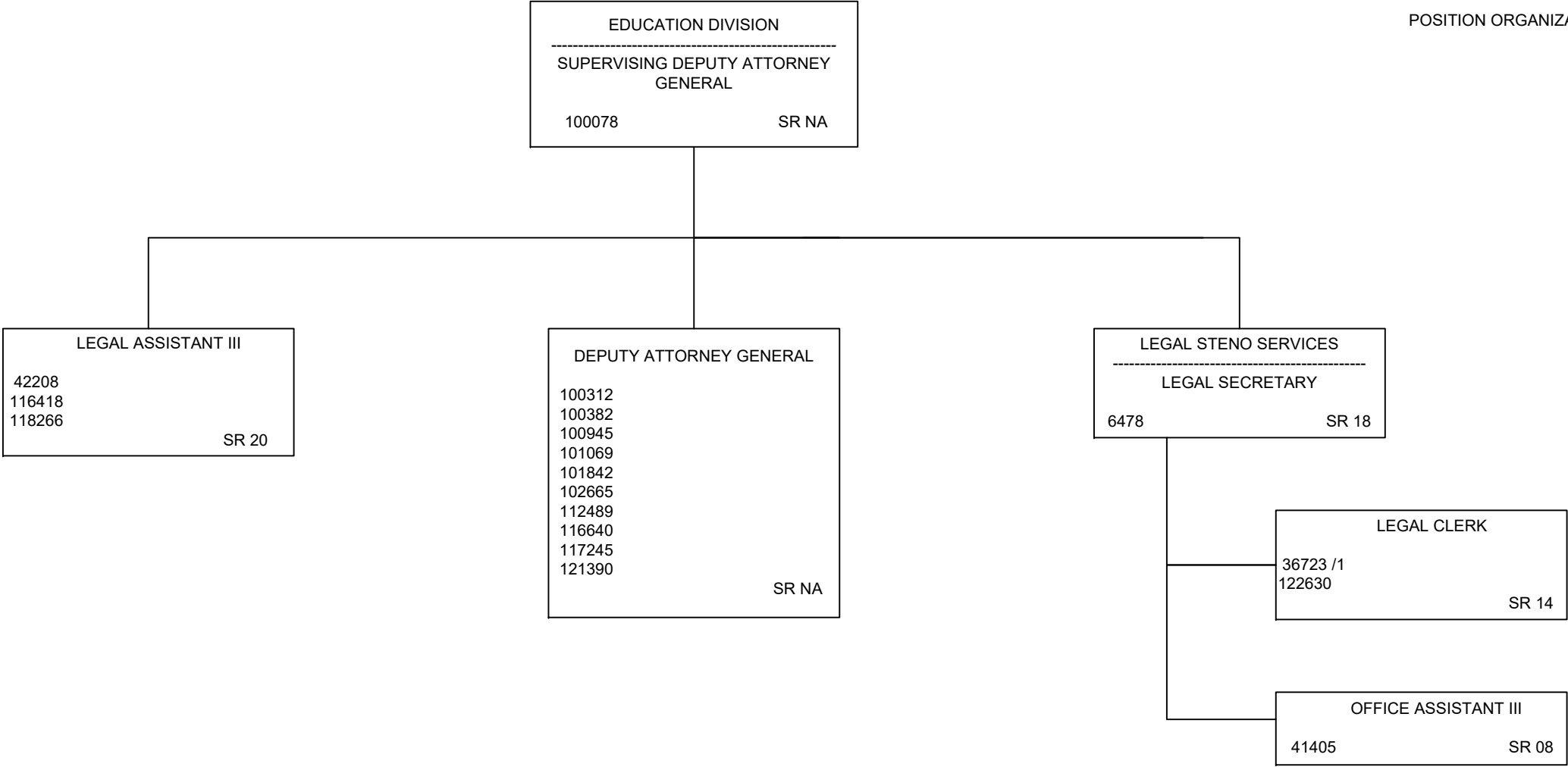






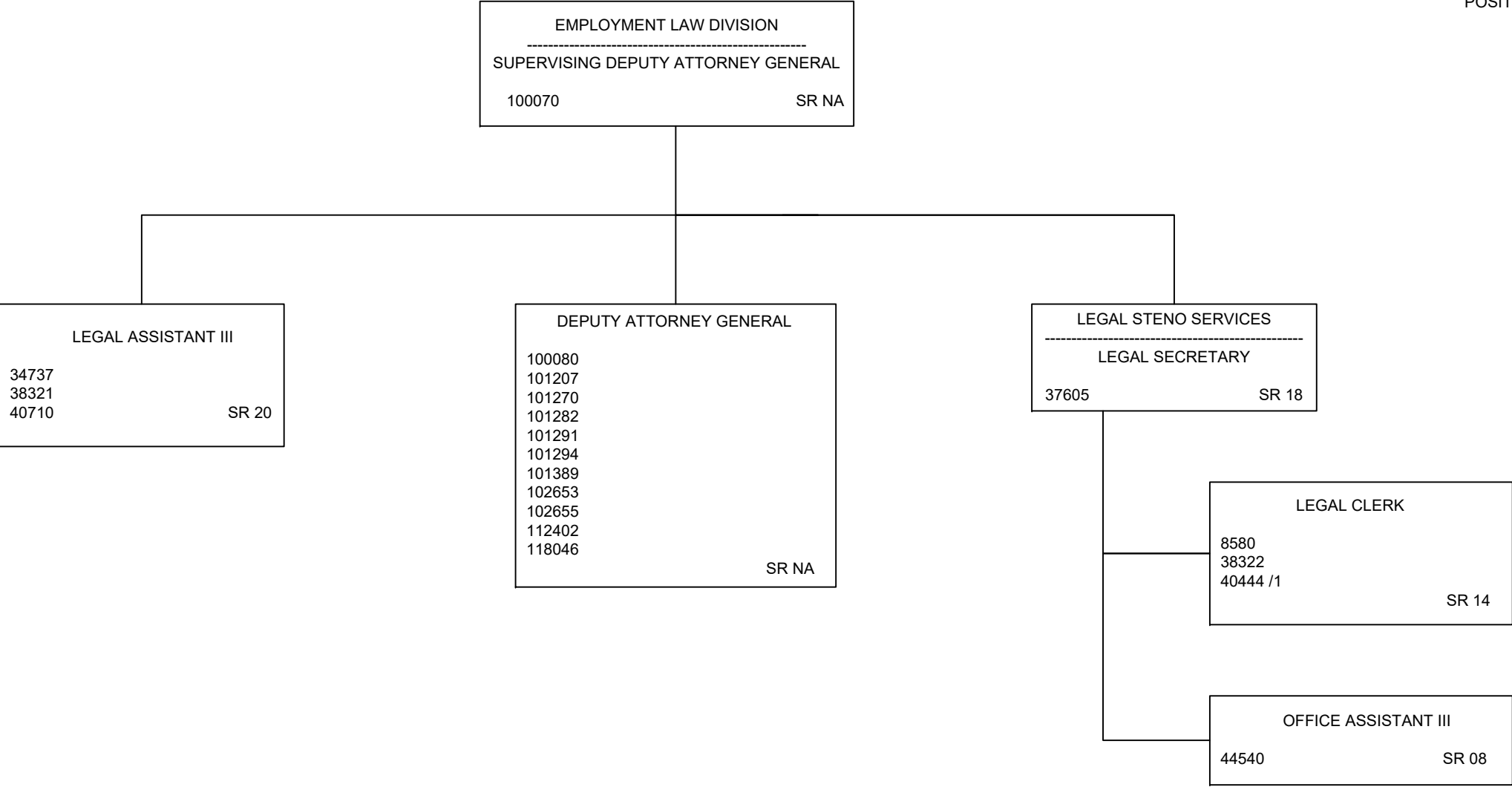

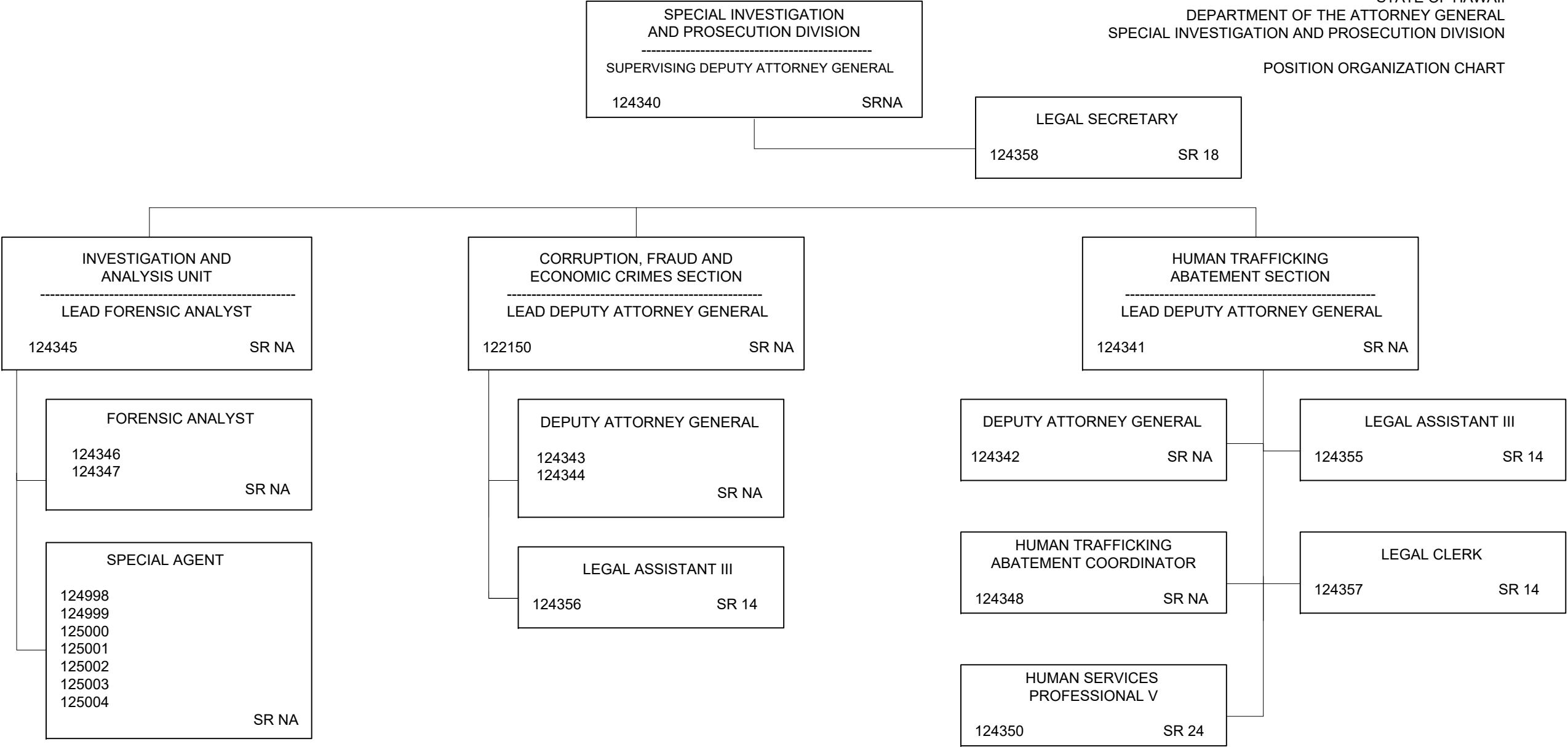
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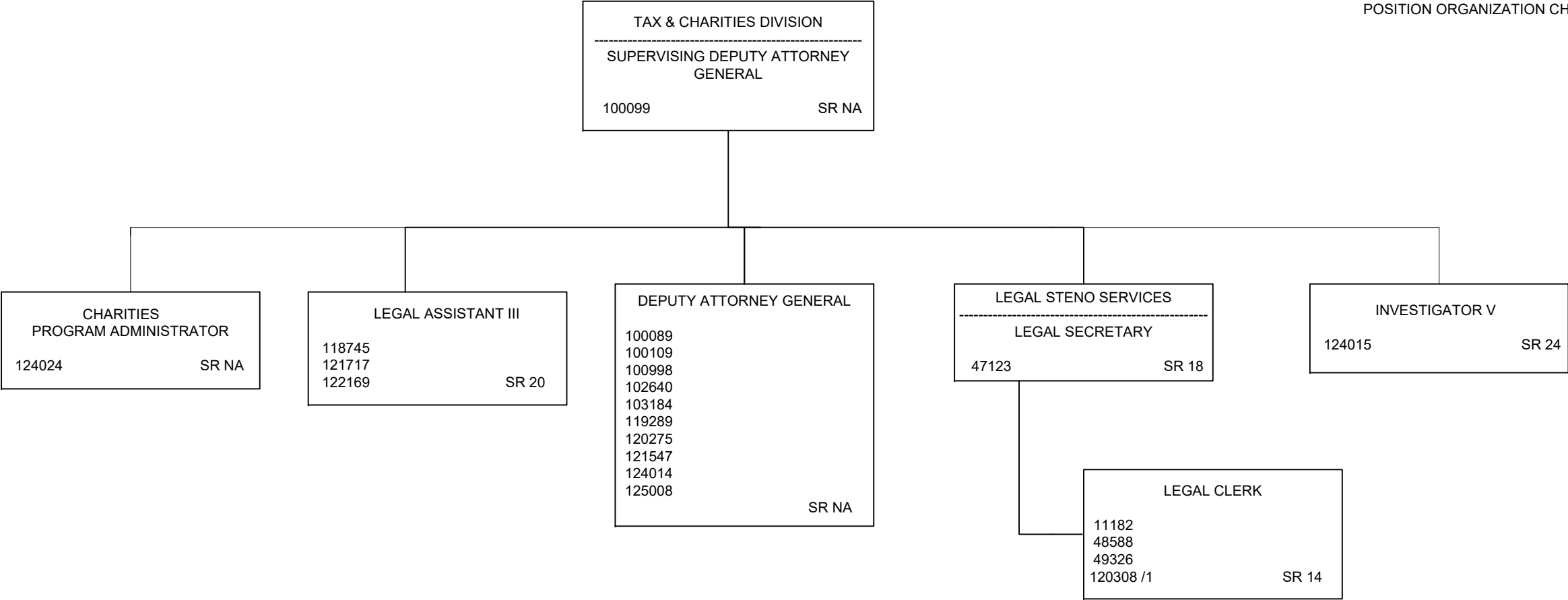




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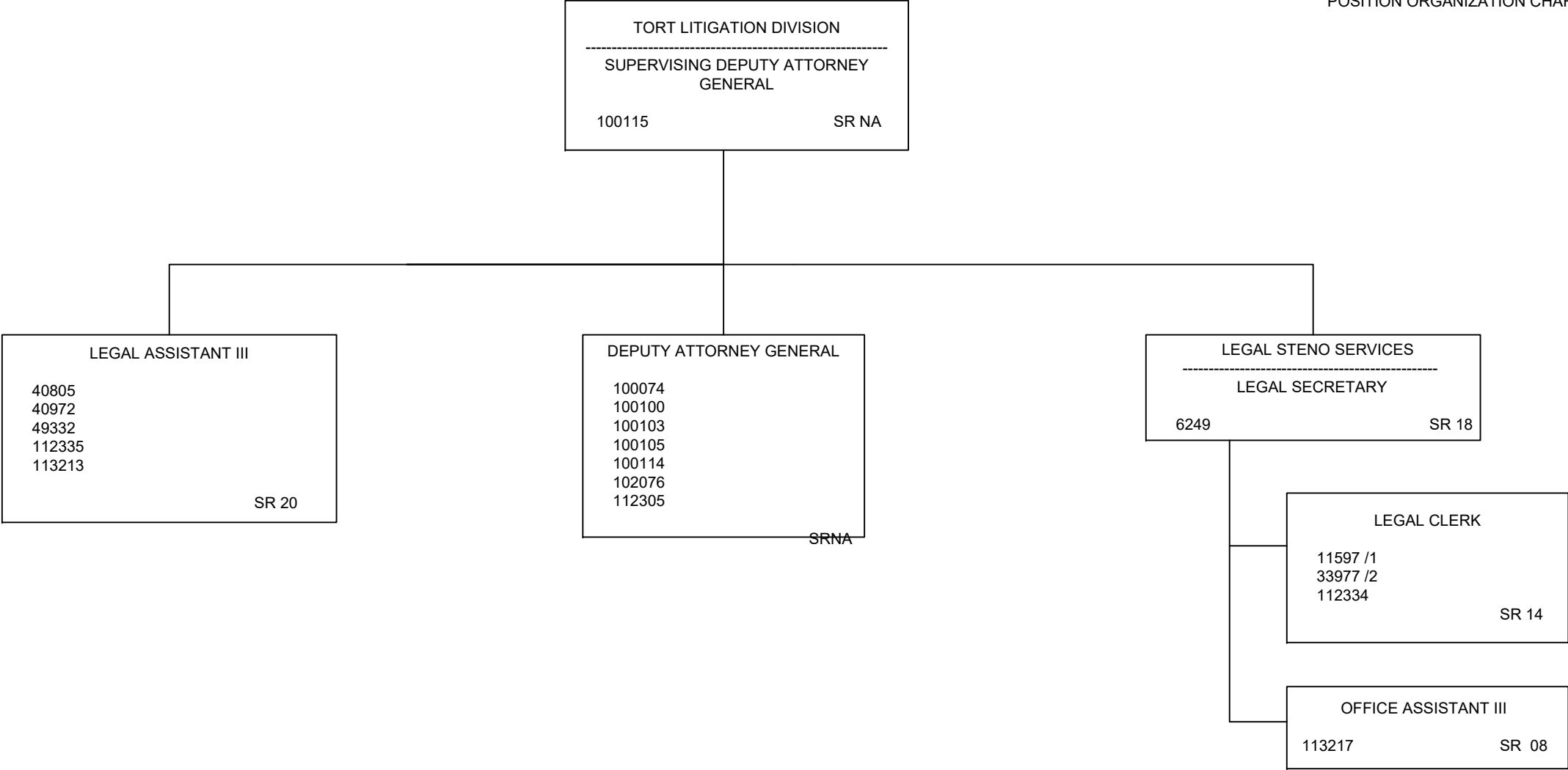


POSITION ORGANIZATION CHART
