The Outdoor Circle started the movement against billboards and visual pollution in Hawaii over a century ago, resulting in a culture and laws that protect our unique special visual and scenic environment. It is not an exaggeration to say that Hawaii is the envy of the nation in this regard, and is also held up as an international role model in eradication of billboards, forced consumption of advertisements in the public view plane, and excessive, unnecessary signage.

Lamentably, we have found over the decades the relentless need to protect from constant challenges or proposed laws that would weaken, degrade and pollute our collective visual space. Even in 2026, there have been at least three bills introduced before the legislature, again, that seek to compromise our hard-won laws that protect our unique visual environment. Despite these challenges, the public has been overwhelmingly and consistently been opposed to any weakening of our signage laws protecting our visual space and view planes.

It is therefore extremely heartening to see that SB2004 SD1 is being offered to strengthen our existing signage laws. As the preamble of SB2004 SD1 says in the first line: "The legislature finds that unlawful outdoor advertising and display of billboards cause multiple problems for public safety, waste management, and community pollution."

While the focus of this bill is for illegal postings on utility poles, the rationale is correct—this unnecessary visual pollution is distracting and dangerous, creating major safety hazards, and obstructs sightlines as many studies have confirmed for all outdoor signage, posting and billboards. We look forward to working with the sponsors of this bill to defeat other egregious bills this legislative on other challenges to our vital and respected signage laws that have defined Hawaii for over a century.

We applaud introducers of this bill for their vision, understanding, and support of this important issue for Hawaii.

We wholeheartedly support the passage of SB2004 SD1.
