Aloha Chair Dela Cruz, Vice-Chair Moriwaki, and members of the committee:

The Department of Defense provides written testimony in **STRONG SUPPORT** of **SB2138**.

This bill simply authorizes the Adjutant General to award tuition assistance for graduate degrees at the University of Hawaii to qualified enlisted personnel, warrant officers, and company grade officers (O-1 through O-3) in the Hawaii National Guard (HING). Currently, we can only authorized state tuition assistance funds for undergraduate degrees.

Expanding the HING State Tuition Assistance Program to include graduate-level education is important for two primary reasons. First, allowing our servicemembers to pursue graduate degrees continues to professionalize the force which is absolutely critical in this era where our Soldiers and Airman need to be smarter than they have every been. Second, competition for talent among the military services and industry on-island is as challenging as it ever has ever been. The passage of this bill will help ensure the HING can recruit and retain the best and brightest over competing services, and that we will continue to maintain a quality force that is capable of responding to state emergencies in our communities and to defend the Nation when called.

Chair Dela Cruz, Vice Chair Moriwaki, and Members of the Committee:

The University of Hawai'i supports SB 2138 – Relating to the Hawaii National Guard State Tuition Assistance Program, which would expand the Hawai'i National Guard State Tuition Assistance Program to include graduate degree programs at the University of Hawai'i (UH) for eligible members of the Hawai'i National Guard.

The University of Hawai'i (UH) strongly supports this measure, which aligns with UH's mission as the State's public system of higher education to serve Hawai'i's workforce needs, support military-affiliated students, and strengthen the State's long-term human capital.

The Hawaii Military Affairs Council ("MAC") supports SB 2138.

The MAC was established in 1985 when the Chamber was appointed by the State to serve as the liaison to the military. The MAC advocates on behalf of Hawaii's military, and is comprised of business leaders, academic institutions, State and County officials, members of the CODEL, community leaders, labor unions and organizations and retired U.S. flag and general officers. The MAC works to support Hawaii's location as a strategic U.S. headquarters in the Indo-Asia-Pacific region which is crucial for U.S. national and homeland security.

Providing tuition assistance for both undergraduate and graduate studies is a cost-effective way to recruit and retain highly skilled service members, enhance leadership development, and ensure a well-educated force that can better support State and federal missions. This bill also strengthens the long-standing partnership between the Department of Defense and the University of Hawai'i by keeping Guard members in-state for their education and careers.

Aloha Chair Dela Cruz, Vice-Chair Moriwaki, and members of the committee:

The Department of Defense (DEF) provides written testimony in **STRONG SUPPORT** of **SB2138**.

This bill proposes to expand the Hawai'i National Guard's (HING) current State Tuition Assistance Program (STAP) policy to award up to 50% tuition assistance for graduate degrees for eligible Hawai'i National Guard (HING) members. The bill extends tuition assistance for graduate degrees to qualified enlisted personnel, warrant officers, and company-grade officers (Lieutenant through Captain).

There are three key points I would like to highlight for your consideration. First, extending the state tuition bill to include graduate degrees provides resources to professionalize the workforce. Second, competition for talent across the islands among the military services and the civilian sector is severe. This bill ensures the HING can compete, acquire, and retain the best and brightest to respond to emergencies in our communities and to the Nation when called to do so. Lastly, there is enough flexibility and controls within the existing program, which is currently funded at \$250,000, to implement this bill without requesting additional funding.

The following background is provided on the existing program. STAP is a critical recruiting and retention tool providing a financial resource to mitigate tuition costs for both Hawai'i Army and Air National Guard members. The current STAP reimbursement program covers 100% tuition at University of Hawai'i (UH) school system, community colleges and 4-year colleges. HING enrollment for the current Fall semester utilizing State Tuition includes 54 students attending a variety of programs at community colleges, UH Manoa, West Oahu, and UH Hilo. Top bachelor's degrees pursued through STAP include Business Administration, Public Administration and Liberal Arts degrees.

Currently, the Hawai'i Air National Guard (HIANG) Federal Tuition Assistance is only available to Active Guard Reserve (AGR) and deployed airmen; therefore, STAP is particularly significant for HIANG part-time drilling members.

Overall assessment across the country regarding STAP revealed 40 of the 54 States, Territories, and the District of Columbia offer graduate degree tuition assistance. If approved, this bill will align Hawai'i's STAP with other state programs nationwide.
