
SB 3090 SD1 – MAKING EMERGENCY APPROPRIATIONS FOR PUBLIC  
EMPLOYMENT COST ITEMS

Chair Dela Cruz, Vice Chair Moriwaki, and Members of the Committee:

Thank you for the opportunity to present testimony today. The University of Hawai'i **supports** SB 3090 SD1, Making Emergency Appropriations for Public Employment Cost Items. This bill makes emergency appropriations for collective bargaining cost items for members of BU01 and BU10 and their excluded counterparts to resolve issues related to temporary hazard pay for fiscal year 2025-2026.

In this fiscal year, the University of Hawai'i (UH) paid nearly \$6 million in temporary hazard pay to current and former UPW employees or their beneficiaries as a result of an arbitration award. Although funds were appropriated in Act 29, Session Laws of Hawai'i 2025, they were insufficient to fully cover the costs for every department in the state, and UH has not received its share of general funds, amounting to \$5,260,963.48, to cover the costs associated with these payments that were already made. We respectfully request the inclusion of these funds to make UH whole in this matter.

**MAKING EMERGENCY APPROPRIATIONS FOR PUBLIC EMPLOYMENT COST ITEMS**

The Department of Budget and Finance (B&F) supports moving this Administration proposal, or a similar bill, as collective bargaining negotiations regarding the issue of temporary hazard pay (THP) are currently in progress and additional appropriations are needed for arbitration awards that have already been issued and for a supplemental arbitration award.

As submitted, this measure appropriates and authorizes unspecified amounts to cover the balance of requirements associated with a THP settlement agreement for employees of the Department of Education (DOE), as well as arbitration awards for employees of the University of Hawai'i and other State of Hawai'i Executive Branch departments represented by United Public Workers, Bargaining Units (BU) 1 and 10, as provided by Act 29, SLH 2025. In addition, the supplemental award issued for employees of the other State of Hawai'i Executive Branch departments for BUs 1 and 10 is now final.

A Governor's Message (GM) with the included and excluded requirements of the arbitration awards was transmitted to the Legislature on February 25, 2026. The amounts do not include funding for an agreement or arbitration award for DOE, as not all matters have been resolved. Please refer to the GM for the cost details. B&F further recommends that the Committee adopt the proposed draft S.D. 2 included in the GM. For the Committee's convenience, the GM is included as an attachment.

Aloha Senate President Kouchi and Speaker Nakamura:

Arbitration awards (University of Hawai'i and other State Executive Branch departments) have been issued concerning United Public Workers (UPW) class action grievances for Units 1 (Blue Collar Employees) and 10 (Institutional, Health, and Correctional Workers) relating to temporary hazard pay (THP) during the COVID-19 pandemic. Funding was provided for these awards by Act 29, SLH 2025. However, the appropriations are insufficient to cover the balance of requirements, so additional funding is being requested. Additionally, the supplemental award issued for employees of the other State Executive Branch departments is final. The amounts do not include funding for an agreement or arbitration award for the Department of Education, as not all matters have been resolved.

The following is a summary of the included and excluded requirements of the arbitration awards for the current fiscal biennium being transmitted to the Legislature for appropriation:

MAKING EMERGENCY APPROPRIATIONS FOR PUBLIC EMPLOYMENT COST  
ITEMS.

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:**

1 PART I

2 SECTION 1. This Act is recommended by the governor for  
3 immediate passage in accordance with section 9 of article VII of  
4 the Constitution of the State of Hawaii.

5 PART II

6 SECTION 2. There are appropriated or authorized from the  
7 sources of funding indicated below to collective bargaining  
8 statewide (BUF 102) the following sums or so much thereof as may  
9 be necessary for fiscal year 2025-2026 to fund collective  
10 bargaining cost items associated with grievances filed under  
11 agreements negotiated with the exclusive representative of  
12 collective bargaining units (1) and (10), and for their excluded  
13 counterparts. The amounts are for arbitration awards for the  
14 university of Hawaii and other executive branch departments  
15 related to temporary hazard pay. These amounts are in addition  
16 to the amounts provided in Act 29, Session Laws of Hawaii 2025:



Chair Dela Cruz, Vice Chair Moriwaki, and Members of the Committee:

The Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation (DCR) **supports** Senate Bill (SB) 3090, Senate Draft (SD) 1, which seeks to make emergency appropriations for collective bargaining cost items for the members of Bargaining Units (BU) (1) and (10) and their excluded counterparts to resolve issues related to temporary hazard pay (THP) for fiscal year 2025-2026.

DCR employs the largest number of Bargaining Unit 10 employees statewide. During the COVID-19 pandemic, these employees continued to provide essential services under hazardous conditions. In the Arbitration between United Public Workers (UPW) and the State of Hawai'i, the Arbitrator awarded UPW the THP to its BUs 1 and 10, which required DCR to pay approximately \$31.1 million to its Unit 1 and Unit 10 employees who qualified for the THP.

However, the amount of \$14 million appropriated in Act 29, Session Laws of Hawai'i 2025, is insufficient to fully reimburse DCR for these payments. As a result,


several DCR programs face a critical shortfall and will not have sufficient funds to cover payroll in the last quarter of this fiscal year.

Passage of SB 3090, SD 1 is essential to ensure that DCR can maintain operations and meet its payroll obligations without disruption. This measure will provide the emergency appropriations necessary to uphold collective bargaining agreements and sustain the effective functioning of our correctional system.

DCR respectfully requests the Legislature's favorable consideration and immediate passage of SB 3090, SD 1.

Chair Dela Cruz, Vice Chair Moriwaki, and members of the Committee:

The Department of Law Enforcement (DLE) supports Senate Bill 3090, Senate Draft 1 (SD1). This bill makes emergency appropriations for collective bargaining cost items for the members of Bargaining Units 1 and 10 and their excluded counterparts to resolve issues related to temporary hazard pay for the fiscal year 2025-2026.

The Department of Law Enforcement strongly supports this measure, as it directly addresses the welfare and compensation of law enforcement personnel and other public employees who have served under hazardous conditions. Temporary hazard pay is a critical component of fair and equitable compensation for employees who are required to perform their duties in environments that pose extraordinary risks to their health and safety. The emergency appropriation sought under this bill ensures that these employees are recognized and compensated appropriately for the sacrifices they continue to make in service to the people of this State.

The DLE recognizes that collective bargaining agreements are foundational to maintaining a productive and stable workforce. Ensuring that cost items negotiated through the collective bargaining process are funded in a timely manner is essential to upholding the integrity of those agreements and the trust placed in the State by its employees. A failure to appropriate funds for agreed-upon cost items, particularly those related to hazard pay, could undermine employee morale, damage labor relations, and negatively impact recruitment and retention efforts across law enforcement and other critical public service sectors.

Furthermore, the emergency nature of this appropriation underscores the urgency of addressing these obligations without delay. The men and women covered under Bargaining Units 1 and 10, as well as their excluded counterparts, have performed their duties with professionalism and dedication. It is incumbent upon the State to fulfill its obligations to these employees in a prompt and decisive manner. The DLE firmly believes that investing in the compensation and well-being of our workforce is an investment in public safety and the continued delivery of essential services to the community.

DLE needs emergency appropriations for fiscal year 2025-2026, amounting to \$322,371.00 in general funds and \$191,826.00 in Interdepartmental transfer funds.

This measure will ensure there is sufficient funding to reimburse departments for United Public Workers Temporary Hazard Pay payments made earlier this fiscal year. DHHL supports resolving certain issues concerning temporary hazard pay through this measure.
