Comments: Thank you for the opportunity to present testimony in support of the nomination of Jerry Kaluhiwa to the Kaneohe Bay Regional Council. As a resident of Kaneohe and a member of the Ko`olaupoko Hawaiian Civic Club, I know that Jerry's years-long commitment to the health of the Bay is paramount. ince legislation sunsetting the Kaneohe Bay Regional Council as of June 30, 2010, was passed over the objections of those concerned with the health of Kaneohe Bay, the Bay has been without an organized community group mandated by law to oversee activities in the Bay. As a result, illegal activities on Bay and at He`eia Small Boat Harbor have increased, leading to adverse impacts on the reefs, including the decline of fish. As a volunteer, Jerry has undertaken several projects in coordination with the Hawaii Institute of Marine Biology to survey the reefs, fish, and limu to get a record of the decline.
