## Thursday, June 27, 2024

The Senate of the Thirty-Second Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Special Session of 2024, convened at 11:02 a.m. with the President in the Chair.

The Roll was called showing all Senators present, with the exception of Senators Fukunaga, Gabbard, Ihara, Kidani, Kim, Richards, and San Buenaventura who were excused.

The President announced that he had read and approved the Journal of the First Day.

Senator Keohokalole introduced Vincent Tan, a Kalani High School graduate and summer intern studying psychology at Connecticut College. Accompanying him in the gallery was committee clerk Jaymee Weisberg.

The Chair, in good humor, expressed his hope that Mr. Tan's experience in the Senate would not lead him to change his major after "studying [their] psychology."
